Kindergarten in govt schools

The Cabinet also approved starting kindergarten (LKG and UKG) classes in 276 public schools of the state. They were being introduced as part of the National Education Policv. The government will create the necessary infrastructure. Nursery teachers and other staff will be appointed by the The ambitious project government.

Rs 35 cr for e-learning

With an objective to implement digital learning at government colleges from the current academic year itself, the state Cabinet set aside Rs 35 crore. The funds will be used to provide digital tools for 230 first grade degree, 87 polytechnic and 14 engineering colleges run by the government.

Damage to public property to prove costly

Several ordinances, which will be replaced as bills and placed in the upcoming legislature session. were also discussed during the meeting. The Cabinet also cleared an ordinance with amendments to some provisions of Karnataka Epidemic Diseases Act. The changes were under four heads and would allow the government to impose a penalty for damages to public property during a pandemic equivalent to twice the cost of losses suffered.
