Bommai says it's conspiracy to create political instability

More Ministers, MLAs Likely To Seek Injunctions

Bengaluru/ Hyderabad: On the day six ministers in the BS Yediyurappa cabinet secured a court injunction restraining media from airing or publishing anything defamatory about them, the state's home minister Basavaraj Bommai talked of attempts to destabilise the state politically.

He said the police suspect some forces of trying to blackmail elected representatives after honey-trapping them with the aim to create political instability in the state.

Bommai told reporters their suspicion stems from the fact that even after five days of the Ramesh Jarkiholi CD case becoming public, neither the woman has come forward nor the complain-

nant has disclosed anything.

"Such long delays either by the woman or complainant can only mean one thing: A bigger political conspiracy could be at play to create political instability in the state," he said.

gain similar restraint orders against the ministers.

Six ministers — B Basavaraj, K Sudhakar, BC Partipati, Shivaram Hebbar, ST Somashekar and KC Narayana Gowda — had moved the court on Friday after water resources minister Ramesh Jarkiholi resigned after a CD was leaked to the media.

In free hearing before the court, the court restrained 67 media organisations from airing or publishing any defamatory comment about the six ministers. However, the ex parte order passed by Additional City Civil and Sessions Judge Mayo Hall unit, clarified that media houses can publish unauthenticated and true news after verification without making defamatory remarks about the six ministers.

These six ministers were part of 17 rebel MLAs who tendered their resignation from the House in July 2016 and headed to Mumbai. This eventually led to the fall of the Congress-JD(S) coalition government and paved the way for Yeddyurappa-led BJP to come to power. These ministers sought injunctive order following activist Dinesh Malchalli claiming he was in possession of more CDs shown a minister and two important personalities.

"We have definite information through our sources that a

conspiracy has been hatched to run a smear campaign during the ongoing budget session and make us resign," Somashekhar said defending their decision.

Union minister DV Sadanand Gowda, however, said it would embarrass the party. Sudhakar countered that they discussed the decision with the party high command and state BJP chief.

Reacting to HD Kumaraswamy's charges that a Rs 5-crore deal had been struck in the Jackal CD case, Bonhwali said he is taking note of all statements made by senior politicians. "Revereswamy has spoken about a Rs 5-crore deal and some others that see CDs of 19 MLAs will be released. We have directed police to probe these angles," he added.

The Congress demanded resignation of the ministers besides seeking a judicial probe into the apprehensions which led them to move court. "Now it is the moral responsibility of the CM to drop them from the cabinet," said state Congress spokesperson Sanjeev Enagi.
