Notice against Kerala Speaker to be taken up

Assembly Budget session begins today

The Opposition notice for discussion on a resolution seeking to remove Speaker P. Sreeramakrishnan for his alleged role in the gold smuggling case will be taken up during the 14-day Budget Session of the Assembly beginning on Friday.

Indian Union Muslim League (IUM) member M. Ummer's notice to the Legislative Secretary in this regard was "in order" and the Business Advisory Committee would decide on the discussion, Mr. Sreeramakrishnan said on Thursday.

Mr. Ummer had said in the notice that the Speaker had lowered the esteem of the Assembly by associating with the accused in the high-profile case relating to the smuggling of gold via the diplomatic channel of the

UAE consulate. The association with the suspects had brought disrepute to the Assembly, Mr. Ummer said.

The Speaker said the budget session would witness more of the 'e-niyamasabha' (e-Assembly) as part of paperless Assembly initiative.

On the breach of privilege notice moved by the Congress member V.D. Satheesan against Dr. Isaac, the Speaker said the report of the Privileges and Ethics Committee would be

placed in the House as soon as it is submitted.

On the complaints of violating party whip from two factions of the Kerala Congress (M), the Speaker said he had already heard the factions led by Jose K. Mani and P.J. Joseph. After the joint hearing, the Speaker said he would take a call on which faction was the official one.
