## Central team begins flood loss assessment in four districts

They visit Kodagu, Belagavi, Hubballi, and Gadag

Inter-Ministerial teams visited the flood-hit districts of Kodagu, Belagavi, Hubballi, and Gadag on Tuesday for a spot assessment of the damage caused to crops, houses and other infrastructure in the recent floods that ravaged the districts.

At Kodagu, the team comprising K.V. Prathap, Joint Secretary of Union Home Ministry, and others visited coffee plantations and places ravaged by rain and landslip. It also visited Bhagamandala where the house of the priest Narayanachar once stood. Out of the five who went missing after a landslip hit the area, the bodies of the priest and two others were recovered.

Deputy Commissioner of the Kodagu Annes Kanmani Joy informed the team that

heavy rainfall and landslip had affected 115 villages. It had caused damage to crops on 41,026 hectares and infrastructure to the tune of ₹598.56 crore.

At Belagavi, the team comprising senior scientist

from the Directorate of Oil Seeds Development in Hyderabad R. Manohar and others met farmers who complained that they had lost all their crops.

Another team visited Gadag district.
