Session to end on tomorrow

BENGALURU, DHNS: The ongoing winter session of the legislature, scheduled till December 15, will be curtailed to end Thursday, five days ahead of schedule. Speaker Vishweshwar Hegde Kageri said that the decision was taken at the Business Advisory Committee meeting in view of the upcoming Gram Panchayat elections. Several MLAs had urged the government to curtail the session so they can prepare for the two-phased polls on December 22 and 27. Originally, the government had announced that the winter session will be held till December 15, with the last two days reserved for a discussion on 'One Nation, One Election'. This topic will now be taken up in the next session, Kageri said.

'No response from CM'

Leader of the Opposition Siddaramaiah lamented that Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa had not responded to any of his letters, but Union Minister Narendra Singh Tomar did. "I wrote to Tomar on June 22 and a reply came in October. Although late, he at least responded. In your government, nobody replies. Even officials don't provide information. Is there democracy in Karnataka?" he said. "I've even written to PM Modi. But then, when you yourself don't reply to my letters, why will he?"

Speaker loses cool, again

For the second day in a row, Speaker Vishweshwar Hegde Kageri lost his cool when legislators, especially those from the ruling side, were huddling in groups. Also, Law Minister J C Madhuswamy was irked when none of the legislators across parties whose motions for discussing matters of public importance came up. "How can this be the state on the second day itself? Don't bring up their subjects next time if they can't be present in the House," he urged the Speaker.
