K'taka ready to tweak law to curb cow vigilantism

Bengaluru: A day after the high court made observations on the recently passed anti-cow slaughter ordinance, law minister JC Madhuswamy said the government is ready to make changes to prevent vigilantism in the name of protecting cattle.

The Karnataka Prevention of Slaughter and Preservation of Cattle Ordinance, 2020, came into effect last we-

ek. One of its provisions offers legal protection to those who "act in good faith" to prevent cow slaughter. The high court had said without supporting rules, even farmers transporting cattle for farming could be arrested and prosecuted. Hearing a PIL, it sought the government's response on the issue.

Madhuswamy said, "We have, with good intention, included a provision that empowers common people to stop those transporting cows for the purpose of slaughter..."
