Rahul bats for Tamil Nadu MPs in Lok Sabha

'Speaker's decision not to allow members from the State to ask supplementaries is unacceptable'

Mr. Gandhi intervened. saying it was an issue at the heart of the people of Tamil Nadu, and supplementaries should be allowed. As the Speaker took up the next question, DMK leader T.R. Baalu vociferously protested that they should be allowed

to ask supplementary questions.

When the Speaker continued with the next question, members of various Opposition parties, including the DMK, the Congress and the NCP, walked out. Trinamool Congress members, however; did not join the walkout.

Addressing the media outside, Mr. Gandhi once again referred to Monday's Ouestion Hour when he claimed that he was not allowed a second supplementary to his starred question on 50 wilful defaulters.

"I am a Member of Parliament, I have certain rights and he can't take away my rights. But today, our Tamil [Nadu] MPs wanted to ask a supplementary about the Tamil language... This is an absolute insult to the people of Tamil Nadu," he said.

In a tweet, Mr. Gandhi called it a departure from the established parliamente practice.

"The people of Tamil Medu were disrespected in Par liament today when the Speaker refused to allow a supplementary question the #Tamil language. strongly protest this injustice done to the Tamil people 3 the disregard for established practises & traditions of Pasliament," he said.

During Zero Hour, the leader of the single largest Opposition party, Adhir Raujan Chowdhury, spoke about the hike in the excise duty cas petrol and diesel. He alleged that the government back cheated the common man.

Dayanidhi Maran of the DMK made a similar allegotion, saying a "serious loo!" was taking place.
