Thiny race shields, blue gloves and a small bottle of Jhand canitizer welcomed legislators at the Legislative Assembly on Monday when the monsoon ression started amid the Covid 19 pandemic.

The welcome kit, comprising these three items, was mandatory for legislators to use. More than 60 MLAs have been infected with Covid-19, because of which there was spare attendance in the Assembly hall. Glass shields anached to the seats separated the members, who were made to keep one seat vacant in between them.
