## rm bills get President's assent

Farmer organisations plan Kurukshetra meet from Oct 8 to take the agitation pan-India

HOURS before three contentious farm sector bills became law after President Ram Nath Kovind's assent, farmer leaders here decided to hold consultations with their counterparts across the country from October 8 at Kurukshetra to evolve a pan-India agitation strategy so as to pressure the Centre to recall the new pieces of legislation.

According to a gazette notification, the President gave assent to The Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill, 2020, The

The Opposition had urged Kovind to return the bills, saying they were passed without following due process.

While the farm agitation continues to rock Punjab, elsewhere it has not found similar resonance. Bharatiya Kisan Union's (Rajewal Group) Punjab president Balbir Singh Rajewal said, "A meeting was held on Sunday in which leaders of farm organisations from Punjab, Haryana,

Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh took part. To take the agitation pan-India, it was decided that, on October 8, a marathon meeting will be held at Kurukshetra for two-three days. Two to three
