CD woman: A 28-day wild goose chase for police

The woman, allegedly seen in the sex CD involving former minister Ramesh Jarkiholi, had kept the state police on their toes, literally, for nearly a month.

Ever since the CD was released on March 2, teams of the Bengaluru police and the Special Investigative Team (SIT) virtually fanned out to almost all parts of the country, but failed in tracking her. Their ordeal finally ended on Tuesday, when she landed at the Kempegowda International Airport in Bengaluru.

The police had traced the mobile phone locations of the woman and her accomplices to Goa, followed by Chennai, Hyderabad, Delhi, Lucknow, Gwalior, Bhopal,

Jaipur, Ajmer, Ghaziabad and Chandigarh.

"The woman used to switch on the mobile phone only once or twice a day. Whenever the police traced her mobile phone location, the team would rush to the spot, only to find that she had left the place. After a few hours, the mobile phone location would have changed. By the time, the team reached there, the woman would have shifted elsewhere," said a police officer.

"The police team used to take a minimum of six hours to reach the location. By then, she would have left from there," the officer said.

To mislead the police, the woman used to switch on the mobile phone, just before leaving a particular place, said the officer. "We put our resources, technical and human, to trace the woman, but in vain," the officer said.

It was found that during her stay in the cities of North India, the woman stayed in fairly good hotels and travelled in car and by air.
