

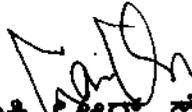

RULES OF PROCEDURES FOR REGULATING STAND-ALONE HOSTELS, HOSTELS OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS OR COLLEGES FOR CHILDREN IN KARNATAKA

The Government of Karnataka is formulating these rules of procedures and guidelines to ensure safety, protection and well-being of children in various residential facilities and for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children in Karnataka by prescribing the minimum standards of care, safety and protection to be provided to children in formal or non-formal, managed by Government/Private departments/agencies/ NGOs/ CSOs/ Individuals, others which could be paid hostels or free hostels. The "RULES OF PROCEDURES FOR REGULATING STAND-ALONE HOSTEL, HOSTELS OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS OR COLLEGES FOR CHILDREN IN KARNATAKA" is developed in reference to the 'Karnataka State Child Protection Policy 2016 as reviewed in 2023', various children related/protection legislations and adapted from the "Regulatory Guidelines for Hostels of Educational Institutions for Children" by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights.

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1. **Title and Scope of the Rules of Procedures for Regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children**
 - (1) These Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children may be called "Rules of procedures for regulating Stand- Alone Hostels, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children in Karnataka".
 - (2) A Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College is an living facility for children that are either independent or officially part of a recognized school or college. It is a place where children stay together, and from this residence, they either attend formal schools or colleges, or they participate in formal or non-formal education, technical, religious or private education offered by same or another organisation, society or trust, NGOs/CSOs, individuals, etc. The Stand-Alone hostels essentially, it functions as a separate accommodation provider for students, where the management of the hostel is distinct from the management of the educational institution the children attend or are associated with. And the Hostels of

Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges are living facility for children that is officially part of a recognized educational entity, the management of the hostel is the same as the management of the educational institution the children attend or are associated with.

- (3) "These Rules of Procedure for regulating Stand-Alone Hostels, Hostels of Educational Institutions, and Residential Schools or Colleges for children shall be applicable to all such commercial or charitable places accommodating children in the age group of 6–18 years. This applicability extends to institutions established under different Schemes, Departments, Ministries, NGOs, CSOs, or independent bodies for the purpose of providing residential facilities to children for formal or vocational education, sports, skill development, vocational training, cultural or miscellaneous arts, or faith-based education. These rules apply to such non-government, private, or any other places, including both fee-charging and free hostels
- (4) "Nothing contained in these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children shall apply to the institutions registered under Section 41 of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 and these institutions shall not house the children defined as CNCP and CICL under JJ Act, 2015 without the placement order by CWC/JJB
- (5) Generally, Stand-Alone Hostels or Hostels attached to Educational Institutions and Residential Schools shall not house children defined as Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP) or Children in Conflict with Law (CICL) under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. However, exceptions may be made to ensure such CNCP children have access to quality education, allowing them to be placed in these Stand-Alone Hostels or Hostels attached to Educational Institutions, provided that the placement is authorized by a specific order from the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and the management of the institution explicitly consents to accept the child. Furthermore, any child placed under this exception shall remain under the direct and mandatory supervision of the CWC and the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), with these authorities conducting individual follow-ups to ensure both the child's educational needs and their care and protection issues are effectively managed. Such exceptional placements are often highly beneficial, as they provide CNCP children with access to superior facilities and the best quality education that might otherwise be unavailable. For instance, an orphan child placed in such a secure and resource-rich hostel environment gains comprehensive care and educational opportunities that significantly enhance their well-being and future prospects.
- (6) Nothing contained in these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children shall apply to any institution that falls under the category of "Child Care Institutions" under section 2 (19), (21), (27), (32), (40), (41), (57) of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

- (7) These Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children will come into force after notification by the State.
- (8) The Schemes/Regulatory bodies under various Ministries of Union/State Government responsible for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for the children in the age group of 6-18 years shall adopt and implement these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children to bring uniformity in norms and standards.

2. Definitions

- (1) "Appropriate Government" in relation to a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children established within the territory of a State, the State Government.
- (2) "Competent authority" means the Deputy Commissioner of the respective District.
- (3) "Child in conflict with law (CICL)" as defined in section 2 (13) of JJ Act, 2015
- (4) "Child in need of care and protection (CNCP)" as defined in section 2 (14) of JJ Act, 2015
- (5) "District" means jurisdiction of the district of the competent authority in respective States.
- (6) "Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children" as defined in 1 (ii). means a place where children under the age of 18 are accommodated for the purpose of receiving education. The operation of both the hostel and the educational program is under different management in respect to the Stand-Alone hostel and the same with respect to hostels of educational institutions and residential schools/colleges.
- (7) "Employee" means any person appointed/engaged by the management of the "Stand- alone hostel for Children and Hostels of Educational Institutions and residential schools/colleges" who is involved in any activity of the said Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (8) "Fee" means expenditure of any kind incurred by the parents/guardian of child for the purpose of accommodation in such residential facility.
- (9) "Charitable" means any non -profit making, non-commercial institute/ entity/ organisation responsible for running and management of a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (10) "Child Welfare Committee (CWC)" means a Committee constituted as per Section 27 of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

- (11) "District Child Protection Unit" (DCPU)" as defined under section 2 (26) of JJ Act, 2015.
- (12) "Guardian" as defined under section 2 (31) of JJ Act, 2015
- (13) NCPCR means the "National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR)" constituted under Section 3 of the Commissions for Protection of Child Rights Act, 2005 (4 of 2006).
- (14) "Norms and Standards" means minimum requirements to establish and run a "Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children" as in point 4 (b) of these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children.
- (15) SCPCR means "State Commission for Protection of Child Rights" constituted under Section 17 of the Commissions for Protection of Child Rights Act, 2005.
- (16) RTE Act, 2009- The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 *CHAPTER II*
- (17) "Institution Based Group Foster Home" are facilities are similar to that of group foster home where maximum of 8 children lives in a family like atmosphere.

CHAPET II
**ESTABLISHMENT OF STAND STAND-ALONE HOSTEL, HOSTELS OF
EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS OR COLLEGEG
FOR CHILDREN**

3. Registration of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges

1. After the enforcement of the Rules of Procedures for Regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children by notification, no Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall operate without registration within the time period of six months (or as stated in the notification) from the date of notification of the said Rules of Procedures.
2. Registration under these Rules of Procedures for Regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children shall be mandatory for any/all Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College(s) for children in the age group of 6-18 years, regardless of whether they are regulated or established under any scheme by any council, statutory body, department, board, NGO, trust, society, firm, company, group, or individual.

3. Procedure of Registration

- (1) The management of every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College in existence on the date of the enforcement of these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children as per point 3 and of every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College proposed to be established on or after that date of notification shall make an application, in prescribed form (Form – I) to the competent authority for registration to run such Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College, as the case may be.
- (2) Every such application shall-
 - (i) be in the prescribed form as annexed;
 - (ii) contain the particulars as per the annexed norms and standards;

4. Procedure of Granting Registration Certificate:

- (1) A. All the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges regulated or established under any scheme of Government by any council/ statutory body/ department/ board shall apply for the registration to their head of Departments/ council/ statutory body/ department/ board at the district level.
- B. Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges established and managed by NGO/ Trust/ Society/ Company/ group or individual shall apply to the Deputy Director of the Department of Women and Child Development (DWCD).

- (2) On receipt of application for registration from an existing or new Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College, the head of the Department or the schemes or Deputy Director of DWCD scrutinizes the applications and shall assess the said Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College from available documents submitted along with the application for ascertaining the compliance to the minimum standards prescribed under the Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges and submits them to the Deputy Commissioner for issuing the Certificate along with their recommendations within one month from the date of receipt of application (Form – II).
- (3) After shortlisting the proposals, a minimum three-member team, comprising officials not below the block level and including an experienced NGO personnel member who has worked with children, will be formed by the Head of the Department/Schemes or the Deputy Director - DWCD. This team shall conduct an inspection to verify compliance with the minimum standards. Additional inspection committees may be constituted according to the volume of such hostels in the districts.
- (4) The inspection committee visit the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College to verify that provisions exist in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children, as per these Rules of procedures for regulating stand- alone hostels for children.
- (5) The Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall fulfil criterion for safe and secure environment for children as per the guideline/manual of concerned department/ministry/ statutory body and annexed checklist; and the visiting team constituted by the competent authority shall ensure that points in the checklist are fulfilled and a minimum standard is maintained by the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College as per number of sanctioned seats before recommending registration.
- (6) On receipt of the application for registration of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College and the report of inspection of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College with the recommendation of respective Department/Scheme/Deputy Director-DWCD the Deputy Commissioner may grant registration certificate within two months for a period of five years and shall determine the capacity of the hostel which shall be mentioned in the registration certificate (Form - III).
- (7) The Deputy Commissioner may deny registration if a hostel lacks adequate facilities. In such cases, the Deputy Commissioner will issue an order within two months of receiving the application, stating that the institution isn't eligible

for registration. This decision will be made in consultation with the department that forwarded the application, always keeping the welfare of the resident children in mind. Depending on the seriousness of the issues, and if rectifications aren't made, a decision will be taken regarding whether to allow the hostel to continue operating until the academic year ends.

- (8) If the Deputy Commissioner does not issue a registration certificate within two months from the date of application, the proof of receipt of application for registration shall be treated as provisional registration to run a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (9) If a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College doesn't meet the required registration criteria, the inspection committee can recommend changes and allow time for these rectifications. A follow-up inspection should then be conducted. If the necessary changes haven't been made, but children are already admitted to schools and cannot be moved, the committee will decide whether to close the hostel or allow it to continue until the academic year ends, based on how serious the issues are.
- (10) The Deputy Commissioner, while taking a decision on the application for registration, may consider the following:
 - (i) Registration of the organisation under any law for the time being in force;
 - (ii) Details of physical infrastructure, water and electricity facilities, sanitation and hygiene, recreation facilities;
 - (iii) Financial position of the organization and maintenance of documents along with audited statement of accounts for the previous year;
 - (iv) Resolution of the Governing Body to run the institution;
 - (v) Provision for services for children such as medical, educational, counselling, etc.;
 - (vi) Arrangements for safety, and security of children;
 - (vii) Details of existing staff with their qualification and experience;
 - (viii) A declaration from the person or the organisation regarding any previous conviction record or involvement in any immoral act or in an act of child abuse or employment of child labour;
 - (ix) Declaration regarding implementation of Child Protection Policy with the required mechanisms in place.
 - (x) Any other criteria as prescribed by the State Government.
- (11) If the application for registration is not disposed of within six months by any officer or officers of any appropriate Government, it shall be regarded as a dereliction of duty on their part by their higher controlling authority and appropriate departmental proceedings shall be initiated.

(12) The period of registration of a hostel shall be five years, and it shall be subject to renewal in every five years.

(13) All institutions running Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children whether run by the government or non-government organisation or individual shall be mandated to be registered.

5. Grant of Certificate of Registration:

On receipt of an application under point 4 (1) and (2), the competent authority may consider to grant the registration Certificate after taking into consideration the particulars contained in such application, provided that the registration shall not be refused unless the applicant has been given an opportunity of making his/her representation.

6. Renewal of Registration:

(1) All hostels/residential schools/collages shall be bound to seek renewal of registration three months prior to the expiry of the period of registration and in case of their failure to seek renewal of registration before the expiry of the period of registration of the institution, the hostel shall cease to be an institution registered under rule 5 of these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children

(2) An application for renewal of registration of a hostel shall be disposed of within sixty days from the date of receipt of application.

(3) The decision on renewal of registration shall be based on inspection done by the three -member committee.

7. Power to Withdraw Registration:

The competent authority may, at any time, withdraw the registration granted under rule 5 of this regulation and shift children to another Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College, if:

(1) Registration has been obtained by fraud, misrepresentation or suppression of material particulars or where after obtaining the registration there is violation of any of the provisions of the Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children or of any of terms or conditions or findings of inspection under point 17, or of the registration or of any direction issued by the competent authority under these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children at any stage.

- (2) The competent authority, after inquiry, finds any violation of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act – 2012 (POCSO Act- 2012) or The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015 as amended in 2021 (JJ A) or any other child related law or violation of measures for safety and security of children in Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges.
- (3) Any serious violation or threat to life of children in a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College

8. Procedure to Withdraw Registration:

- (1) Before withdrawing registration under points the competent authority have to give the management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College an opportunity for making its representation.
- (2) The competent authority before withdrawing the registration and issuing order to close down the institution has to ensure that the children are transferred to any other such registered accommodation thereby ensuring the continuity of the academic session a decision can be taken according to the seriousness of the issue including operating the institution under supervision if children's education is seriously affected until the end of the scholastic year.
- (3) If in any case NCPCR/SCPCR/CWC does not find a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College fit in their observation in the best interest of child, the Commission/CWC may recommend to the competent authority or appropriate Government to withdraw registration after consideration of competent authority through proper procedure.

9. Procedure for Closure

- (1) No Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall be closed without due approval from the competent authority. The approval should be sought by the management through a formal application to the competent authority.
- (2) If the approval is sought in mid-term of teaching, the competent authority before granting approval for closure has to ensure that the children are transferred to any other such registered institution thereby ensuring the continuity of the academic session of the children residing in the hostel. A decision can be taken according to the seriousness of the issue including operating the institution under supervision if children's education is seriously affected until the end of the scholastic year

10. **List of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges:**

The Government Departments or all those who are running the residential facilities including religious institutions should prepare and publish list each year in the website of the departments/institutions, a list containing the names of all Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges with sanctioned capacity which has been granted registration under rule 5, from time to time and a list of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges cancelled during the same period. It is recommended that the Directorate of Women and Child Development Department (DWCD) has a copy of all the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges in the state.

11. **Admission in Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges:**

- (1) In case of the Government run/ aided Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges, the procedure of admission should be in accordance to the norms specified by the appropriate government in such hostels. If in case of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges managed/ run/ established under any scheme of Central/State Government, the procedure of admission shall be as prescribed in scheme as per laws.
- (2) In case of private/unaided/commercial/charitable hostels, the Management shall be responsible to lay down criterion for admission.
- (3) The admission in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College should be done by parents of the child and/or guardian through written consent letter.
- (4) Children who falls in the category of CNCP or CICL should be admitted in such Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges with explicit order of CWC or JJB for quality education and DCPU can follow up such children individually. If any CNCP or CICL children directly admitted, then it shall be the responsibility of the institution to inform CWC/JJB about the admission of CNCP or CICL children to get orders if required.
- (5) After completion of the process of admission, the management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall prepare a list of children every year and submit to the concerned department.

12. Fees

- (1) If any hostel charges fee the same shall be charged only on monthly or quarterly or half yearly basis. The fees charged by private/unaided/commercial institute/entity/ non-charitable organization responsible for running and management of a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall be regulated by appropriate department/government.
- (2) No capitation fee shall be collected by the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges.
- (3) If in case the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College managed/run/established under any scheme of Central/State Government, the fees shall be as prescribed in scheme as per laws.

CHAPTER III

MANAGEMENT OF STAND-ALONE HOSTEL, HOSTELS OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS OR COLLEGE

13. Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College Staff

A Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall maintain an adequate number of staff to manage the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College. The strength of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College personnel shall be directly related to the number of children residing in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College to effectively manage the day to day running of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College complex. The uniformity should be brought in across all institutions on the standards of care for children to protect their best interests.

- (1) A Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall engage Superintendent/s to supervise the activities of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges.
- (2) In case the number of children is less than 30 Superintendent shall also discharge the duties of Warden.
- (3) The recruitment or engagement of superintendents shall be executed by the management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College, and –
 - (i) The superintendent must be competent to exercise overall control in respect of the execution & maintenance of general discipline and spirit

in the hostel/residential schools/colleges, including the welfare, study and other activities of stand- alone hostel.

- (ii) The post of superintendent shall be full time in nature.
- (4) The Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall engage the following staff in adequate number as prescribed by the competent authority viz;
 - (i) Superintendent: one superintendent cum warden for 25-30 children;
 - (ii) one additional warden for every 50 children
 - (iii) Counsellor and Nurse/Paramedic- On visit basis
 - (iv) Security Personnel as appropriate to be decided by Management
 - (v) One Cook cum Sweeper/Cleaner for 25-50 children and as required for more capacity.
 - (vi) Helper, Kitchen Staff, Clerk, Office assistants- if required
 - (vii) The number of posts in each category of staff shall proportionately increase with the increase in the capacity and intake of the institution.
 - (viii) The staff patterns for the scheme/department managed Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges are as prescribed by the scheme/department.
- (5) Superintendent and Warden shall be oriented/trained/sensitized time to time on the child rights issues. It is desirable that appropriate government shall make appropriate provisions for the same.
- (6) In case of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College housing girls, only female Person-in charge and staff shall be appointed.
- (7) Any person associated with a Stand-Alone Hostel; Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College should not have been convicted of an offence or have been involved in any immoral act or in act of child abuse or employment of child labour or in an offence involving moral turpitude.
- (8) The management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College should ensure that at the time of joining the employee as defined in point 2 (f) has to furnish an affidavit that they have never been convicted under The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 as amended in 2021; and Child and adolescents Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986, Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2016, and Protection of Children against Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012
- (9) The management committee of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall ensure that no child shall be forced to follow any faith, identity, name, etc.

14. **Duties and Responsibilities of the staff**

(1) **Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College Superintendent:**

The superintendent of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall;

- (i) Be the overall in-charge of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (ii) Maintain regularity and punctuality of children in attending formal education.
- (iii) Prepare the daily routine for children residing in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College and ensure adherence of daily routine. He/she shall also be responsible for overall development of children.
- (iv) Keep updated records of the institution and all children .
- (v) Ensure the safety, security and well-being of children residing .
- (vi) Immediately report the matter to concerned officials of district administration, in connection to any violations of rights of children.
- (vii) Ensure reporting of serious offences pertaining to child abuse and child sexual abuse as prescribed in Section 19 of the POCSO Act, 2012.
- (viii) Create awareness regarding personal safety (safe touch-unsafe touch), child marriage prohibition, child & adolescent labour and other CP issues amongst all the children residing in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (ix) Ensure regular health check-up of children at least once in a quarter by a registered medical practitioner. All the health records should be preserved until the child resides in the facility.
- (x) Ensure overall improvement of the condition of the hostel from time to time;
- (xi) Ensure reviewing the standards of care are being followed;
- (xii) Facilitate the setting up of children's committees, conducting bimonthly meetings and maintain a register for recording their activities and proceedings.
- (xiii) Ensure that the hostel must at all times be equipped with basic First Aid & Medicine Kit containing band-aids/ bandages, cotton wool and disinfectants for minor injuries. ORS packets, scissors, thermometer and antiseptic ointment should also be part of the medicine kit.
- (xiv) And such other activities defined in Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children or as deemed fit.
- (xv) If a child runs away or missing the management is required file a Police missing complaint in the jurisdictional police Station.

(2) Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College Warden:

The Warden of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall;

- (i) Take regular attendance of children every day.
- (ii) Inspect the dormitories and other premises of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College on daily basis.
- (iii) Take necessary action deemed fit and report any matter pertaining to sickness, injury, abuse of children to the Superintendent.
- (iv) Ensure safety and security of children at all times.
- (v) Check the quality of food on a day to day basis.
- (vi) Maintain and update asset and stock register of dormitories and other rooms designated to the warden.
- (vii) Prepare daily routine and food menu of children.
- (viii) Any time availability of the warden should be ensured.

15. Management Committee of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College

- (1) The Management Committee shall comprise of:
 - (i) The Chairperson of the Management Committee of the stand -alone hostel shall be nominated by the Board/Management or Trust responsible for running of the said hostel.
 - (ii) Superintendent/Warden - Member-Secretary;
 - (iii) Medical Officer – Member;
 - (iv) Principal/Head Master or a teacher from the nearest Government school/ or the school which children attend– Member;
 - (v) One Social Worker from any NGOs or One Psychologist who holds such a qualification
 - (vi) One Counsellor and one representative of District Child Protection Unit/CWC/JJB/SJPU/Child Line and one official representative from local Gram Panchayath/ULB can be inducted if the organisation feels necessary or any other person suggested by organisation.
 - (vii) Any other special invitee with the consent of the Chairperson and management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College.
- (2) The information of the Management Committee along with details of its Members shall be sent to the respective departments for information.
- (3) The Management Committee shall meet at least once in three months.
- (4) The Management Committee shall;

- (i) Set up a complaint and redressal mechanism in every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College and a Children's Suggestion Box shall be installed in every institution at a place easily accessible to children away from the office set up.
- (ii) The key of the Children's Suggestion Box shall remain in the custody of the Chairperson of the Management Committee and shall be checked once in a week by the Chairperson of the Management Committee or his representative in the presence of the members of the Children's Committees.
- (iii) If there is a problem or suggestion that requires immediate attention, the Chairperson of the Management Committee shall call for an emergency meeting of the Management Committee to discuss and take necessary action.
- (iv) In the event of a serious allegation or complaint against the Person-in-charge of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College, he shall not be part of the emergency meeting and another available member of the Management Committee shall be included in his place.
- (v) All suggestions received through the suggestion box and action taken or action required to be taken shall be placed for discussion and review in the meeting of the Management Committee.
- (vi) A Children's Suggestion Book shall be maintained in every institution where the complaints and action taken by the Management Committee are duly recorded and such action and follow up shall be communicated to the Children.
- (vii) The Management Committee shall review the Suggestion/compliments raised in children box during the bimonthly meeting.

16. Children's Committees

- (1) Person-in-charge of every institution for children shall facilitate the setting up of children's committees and these children's committees shall be constituted solely by children with the support of institution personnels.
- (2) Such children's committee shall be encouraged to participate in following activities:
 - (i) improvement of the condition of the institution;
 - (i) reviewing the standards of care being followed;
 - (ii) preparing daily routine and menu chart ;
 - (iii) developing educational, vocational and recreation plans;
 - (iv) reporting abuse and exploitation by peers and caregivers;
 - (v) creative expression of their views through wall papers or newsletters or paintings or music or theatre;

- (3) The Superintendent/warden shall ensure that the children's committees meet once in every month and maintain a register for recording their activities and proceedings, and place it before the Management Committee meetings.
- (4) The Management Committee shall seek a report from the Superintendent/warden on the setting up and functioning of the children's committees, review these reports in their tri-monthly meetings and take necessary action or place the same before the Board or the Committee, wherever required.

CHAPTER IV

NORMS AND MINIMUM STANDARDS

17. **Norms and standards** governing Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children in the age group of 6- 18 years shall be, the following. These are the norms and standards that are normally prescribed in child care institute, it is advised to be guided by the same wherever the possible.

(1) Physical infrastructure:

- (i) While children of both sexes below 10 years may be kept in the same home, separate bathing and sleeping facilities shall be maintained for boys and girls in the age group of 6-10 years;
- (ii) Boys and girls above the age of 10 years shall be accommodated in separate hostels. with separate sleeping facilities for the age group of 6-12 age; 13-18 ge This shall not be applicable for hostels with less than 16 children who live in family like atmosphere where children live.
- (iii) If hostel is only for boys or only for girls' children could be accommodated for the age group of 6-18 years in same hostel with separate sleeping facilities.
- (iv) Any facilities having students above 18 years should have separate residential facilities
- (v) The superintendent/warden shall stay in the institution provided with quarters or needed facility and in case of leave or absence any other senior staff member of the institution shall stay in the institution and supervise the overall care of the children and take decisions in the case of any crisis or emergency.
- (vi) There shall be adequate lighting, all-weather appropriate arrangements, ventilation, safe drinking water, clean and accessible gender and age appropriate and disabled friendly infrastructure (If any disabled children are there) including toilets and ensuring safety and security of resident students.

- (vii) All Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges covered under this Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children shall:
- (a) make provision in the building for dormitories; multipurpose hall for study, recreation and other activities; sick room; office room; Dining space; store room; kitchen; toilets; bathing rooms and washing area;
 - (b) make provision of first-aid kit and fire extinguishers;
 - (c) proper lighting and water facility;
 - (d) ensure proper storage and inspection of articles of food;
 - (e) Ensure safe electric installation and water storage to prevent accidents
- (viii) The suggested norms for building or accommodation for children in each institution may be as specified by the department/schemes or for NGO Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges as per Annexure – I. These norms are prescribed for Child Care institutions and shall be implemented wherever possible.
- (ix) "Institution-Based Group Foster Homes" (IBFH) are small-scale, decentralized residential units established within a larger institutional campus. These facilities are structurally similar to foster care guide lines which propose 'Group Foster Homes' but are designed to make a model in child care similar that of families.
- (x) IBGFH is limited to a maximum of eight (8) children in a facility to ensure a non-institution family-like living environment. The unit must provide a minimum of 1200 square feet (S/F) of living space, focused on creating warmth and quality rather than scale. Each home must be staffed by a designated Care Provider who fulfils the role of a parent figure, supported by auxiliary staff, all committed to replicating the emotional safety and routine of a conventional family setup. Critically, these IBGFHs are mandated to provide immediate and high-quality educational support, making the home an integral part of the children's learning pathway.

(2) Minimum Standards for Clothing, Bedding, Toiletries and other Articles

- (i) It should be ensured by the Superintendent of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College that the clothing and bedding of children during their stay in Stand-

Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College either provided by the hostel or parents/guardian of children shall be as per the climatic conditions.

- (ii) The minimum bedding to be provided to the children either by the hostel or parents/guardian of children, which includes mattress, bed sheets, pillow, mosquito net and blanket if required.
- (iii) Clothing for girls either provided by the hostel or parents will include adequate sets of home wear, uniform, colour dress, under garments, bath towel, sweater if required and sanitary pads.
- (iv) Clothing for boys either provided by the hostel or parents/guardian will include adequate sets of home wear, uniform, colour dress, under garments, bath towel and sweater if required.
- (v) Children shall be provided by the hostel or parents/guardian with slippers/sandals; school shoes, socks, umbrella/rain coat, and stationary as per the need.
- (vi) Children shall be provided by the hostel or parents/guardian with hair oil, comb, tooth paste and brush, bathing and washing soap/powder, hair bands for girls and moisturisers if necessary
- (vii) In case of government/government aided hostels, each child shall be provided adequate number of uniforms as per the schemes of the government applicable for children (boys and girls).
- (viii) In case of private/unaided hostels where the above facilities including uniform are not provided by the hostel, and are provided by the parents/guardian, the hostel should intimate minimum standards as prescribed to them at the time of admission of the child and ensure the fulfilment of basic requirements of the child as per the norms.

(3) Sanitation and Hygiene:

Every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall have the following facilities, namely:

- (i) sufficient safe drinking water; water filters or RO should be installed;
- (ii) sufficient water for bathing and washing clothes, maintenance and cleanliness of the premises;
- (iii) proper drainage system with regular maintenance;
- (iv) arrangements for disposal of garbage;

- (v) protection from mosquitoes by providing mosquito nets or repellents;
- (vi) annual pest control;
- (vii) sufficient number of well-lit and airy toilets with proper fittings in the proportion of at least one toilet for seven children;
- (viii) sufficient number of well-lit and airy bathrooms with proper fittings in the proportion of at least one bath room for ten children;
- (ix) sufficient space for washing and drying of clothes;
- (x) place to safe disposal of sanitary napkins in girls Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges;
- (xi) clean and fly-proof kitchen and separate area for washing utensils;
- (xii) maintenance of cleanliness in all the rooms with sweeping and wiping of floor;
- (xiii) cleaning or washing of the toilets and bathrooms every day;
- (xiv) hygienic manner of preparing food;
- (xv) clean and pest proof store for maintaining food articles and other supplies;
- (xvi) disinfection of the beddings at least once a year;
- (xvii) fumigation of a sick room after every discharge in case of contagious or infectious disease.

(4) Daily Routine:

- (i) Every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for Children shall have a daily routine for children developed in consultation with the management committee and children's committee, which shall be prominently displayed at various places within the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College premises.
- (ii) The daily routine may provide, *inter alia*, for a regulated and disciplined life, personal hygiene and cleanliness, physical exercise, yoga, educational classes, organised recreation and games, moral education, group activities, prayer and community singing and special programmes for Sundays, holidays, and festive days.

(5) Nutrition and Diet Scale

The following nutrition and diet standards shall be followed by the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges, namely:

- (i) The food menu will be prepared in consultation with management committee and children's Committee
- (ii) The children shall be provided four meals (breakfast, lunch, evening snacks/tea/milk and dinner) in a day; the meal time shall be decided by the Hostel on basis of school timing and geographical requirements.
- (iii) During medical check-ups by the visiting doctor/at the PHC, if any deficiencies are observed in children, the menu should be prepared in accordance to meet with the nutritional deficiency.
- (iv) Children shall be provided with balanced diet with nutritious food considering the health and growth needs of children or as specified by the department /scheme. The menu would include variety, nutrition, food practices of children and prepared in a hygienic manner.
- (v) Depending on the season, the superintendent shall have the discretion to alter the time for distribution of food
- (vi) Children may be provided special meals on celebrations of festivals and national festival.
- (vii) Sick children shall be provided special diet according to the advice of the doctor.
- (viii) Variation in diet may be as per seasonal and regional variations. Including leafy vegetables, sprouted serials, eggs, curd, seasonal fruits, variety of vegetables, and meat, fish to be considered.
- (ix) The superintendent may make temporary alterations in the scale of diet in individual cases when considered necessary by him, or on the advice of the doctor.

18. Physical and Mental Health

- (1) All children shall undergo a medical check-up at the time of entry into the institution;
- (2) Ensure regular health check-up of children at least once in a quarter by a registered medical practitioner;

- (3) Maintain a medical record of each child on the basis of medical check-up and provide necessary medical facilities; the medical record includes weight and height record, any sickness and treatment, and other physical or mental problems;
- (4) Keep sick children under constant medical supervision;
- (5) Take preventive measures in the event of out-break of contagious or infectious diseases;
- (6) No surgical intervention shall be done on any child without the written consent of the parents/guardian, unless the parent or guardian cannot be contacted and the condition of the child is such that any delay would, in the opinion of the medical officer, involve unnecessary suffering or injury to the health of the child or danger to life;
- (7) It should be ensured that the environment in a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College shall be free from abuse, allowing children to cope with their situation and build confidence;
- (8) Whenever required, Hostel shall seek advice from psychologist, counsellor and provide required therapy/intervention;
- (9) No child shall be administered medication for mental health problems without a psychological evaluation and diagnosis by trained mental health professionals;
- (10) Provide or arrange for counselling and ensure specific mental health interventions for those in need of such services.

19. Recreational Facilities

- (1) Recreational facilities may include indoor and outdoor games, yoga and meditation, music, television, picnic and outings, cultural programmes, gardening and library etc.
- (2) Sufficient play materials shall be provided for outdoor sports and games.
- (3) Picnic and outings may include education fair or visit to science fair, museum, planetarium, botanical garden, zoological garden, etc.
- (4) Management shall provide in regional language, newspapers, children's magazines, books in Braille (as applicable), audio and video devices etc.

20. Enforcement of Child Protection Policy and Measures:

- (1) All Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges accommodating children shall adopt and implement the *Karnataka State Child Protection Policy – 2016 (Revised – 2023)* in its entirety.
 - (i) The Summary of KSCPP is provided (Appendix I).
 - (ii) Key action to be undertaken by Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for effective implementation are detailed (Appendix II)
 - (iii) Endorsement forms on safety measures shall be duly obtained from all children and their parents/guardians (Appendix III)
 - (iv) Endorsement forms ensuring enforcement of the policy shall be obtained from all hostel/institution staff (Appendix IV)
 - (v) The commitment statement of the hostel towards implementation of the Child Protection Policy shall be prominently displayed within the hostel premises (Appendix V).

CHAPTER V

MONITORING AND REDRESSAL OF GRIEVANCES

21. Monitoring and Redressal of Grievances

- (1) The various Departments of the Government providing Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges under their schemes shall prescribe proper monitoring systems as integral part of their schemes/departments.
- (2) Any Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College may be inspected by the competent authority/official authorized by competent authority/ National or State Commission for Protection of Child Rights / CWC / DLSA / TLSA whenever it considers necessary and may communicate the observations to the appropriate Government or competent authority.
- (3) The competent authority should direct the management to rectify the defects, if any, found during the course of the inspection, within a stipulated time.
- (4) The Deputy Commissioner shall constitute multiple Inspection Committee based on the number of total number of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges which may

comprise following officers and other representatives from the Departments, Experts in the field of Child Protection, Law, Development, Health, Education; District Child Protection Officer/unit representative, District Social Welfare Officer, District Backward Class Officer, District Minority officer, District Tribal Welfare Officer, Deputy Director of School Education, Deputy Director of PU Education, Deputy Director Women and Child Development, an NGO personnel who works with children should be part of every inspection committee Department for periodic and regular inspections of the stand- alone hostels, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges and

- (5) The Deputy Commissioner shall review the inspection reports with the inspection committee. The gaps and deficiencies observed through the inspection reports maybe taken up appropriately by the Deputy Commissioner and resolve any/all such gaps emanating through such reports.
- (6) The inspection committee may conduct inspection of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges to ensure that no CNCP child is accommodated in the said hostel without written permission from CWC/JJB.
- (7) In the event of violation made by the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College by housing CNCP and CICL children without the explicit written order from CWC and JJB, shall be treated as violation of Rule 12(iv). Such children will be transferred to a Child Care Institutions registered under Section 41 of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015.
- (8) CWC and JJB can admit the CNCP and CICL children to these residential facilities in consultation with the management of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for quality Education and DCPU unit can visit and follow up such children individually.
- (9) The District Inspection Committee shall carry out inspections of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges in prescribed form once a year and submit a report to the Deputy commissioner of the respective district.
- (10) The District Inspection Committee shall interact with the children during visits to the institution to determine their well-being and to get their feedback.
- (11) Following are the details of State, District and Taluk level committees for monitoring the implementation of this rule of procedure for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children.

- A. State Level Monitoring Committee:** - The Secretary, Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka – Chairperson, Secretaries/Head of Departments/schemes running Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children will be members of the Committee. The Director, Department of Women and Child Development, will be member secretary to the State-level monitoring committee. The Committee shall include the NGOs, CSOs and experts from the area of child protection, law, health and development as members of this committee.
- B. District Level Monitoring Committee:** - Deputy Commissioner of the District – Chairperson, Zill Panchayath Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Superintendent of Police (SP) & Commissioner of Police, District Backward Class Officer, District Minority officer, District Tribal Welfare Officer, Deputy Directors of School Education and PU Education, District Health Officer, Deputy Director Women and Child Development Department, District Child Protection Officer and 2 NGO Representatives – Members, one each representatives and experts from the field of Child Protection, Health, Law, Development should be nominated by the Deputy Commissioner, District Social Welfare Officer – Member Secretary.
- C. Taluk Level Monitoring Committee:** - Thashildar – Chairperson, Taluk Panchayath Executive Officer (EO), Police Inspector/ ACP, Taluk Backward Class Officer, Taluk Minority officer, Taluk Tribal Welfare Officer, Block Education Officer, Taluk Health Officer, Representative of District Child Protection Unit, Child Development Programme Officer (CDPO) and 2 NGO Representatives – Members, one each representatives and experts from the field of Child Protection, Health, Law, Development should be nominated by the Thashildar, Taluk Social Welfare Officer – Member Secretary.
- D. Roles and Responsibility:** - The State, District and Taluk level Monitoring committees shall hold the committee meeting once in every quarter (once in 3 months) and review/redressal on standards of care and implementation of child protection policy and submit the report to the Government.

CHAPTER VI

ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT

22. Accounts and Audit

- (1) Separate annual accounts of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges be maintained by the organization/institution/head of Institution running the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College
- (2) The annual accounts should be prepared certifies by the auditors appointed by the management for this purposc.

- (3) The management has to furnish the annual account at the time of application for renewal of registration to the competent authority.
- (4) It is not applicable for small entities where number of children are less and they are part of larger institutions.

CHAPTER-VII
MISCELLANEOUS

23. Directions of the Appropriate Government

- (1) Without prejudice to the provisions, the appropriate government may, from time to time, issue such directions regarding the management of a Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College as it may think fit and it would be the duty of the competent authority to implement such directions within such time as may be prescribed by the competent authority.
- (2) Any work/duty discharged by any official duly authorised under the provisions contained in these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children must be treated as 'administrative work' of the appropriate Government.

24. Appeal

- (1) Any management aggrieved by any decision of the competent authority under any of the provisions of these Rules of procedures for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children may, within two months from the date of the receipt of the decision by them, prefer an appeal against such decision to appellate authority, as authorised by appropriate Government. The Director, Department of Women and Child Development shall act as appellate authority for the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College run by the NGOs/trust/society/company/ or individuals. The department heads at the state will be appellate authority for Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges run by the Departments or any schemes of the Government.
- (2) Provided that the appellate authority may, in its discretion, allow further time as per section 5 of Limitation Act, 1963 for preferring any such appeal, if it is satisfied that the appellant had sufficient cause for not preferring the appeal in time.
- (3) On receipt of an appeal under point (a) the appellate authority, after giving the appellant an opportunity of making his representations, redress and close the appeal as expeditiously as possible.

25. Support System

Expert teams, including child protection specialists from NGOs and Individual Consultants, shall be placed at the Directorate of Women and Child Development and other departments. They will provide technical, monitoring, and capacity-building support to State, District, and Taluk level mechanisms for strengthening child protection systems and implementing these procedures. To further streamline the efficient registration process, the Deputy Director - DWCD is also empowered to constitute an additional Five-Member Advisory Committee from leading district NGOs, whose primary role shall be to provide support, assist in streamlining procedures, and mobilize volunteers.

The organization/Institution/Head of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children shall maintain separate annual accounts of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children and shall be audited every year by the auditors appointed by the management for larger Hostels.
11. The Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children shall abide by the instructions/directions issued by the appropriate Government from time to time.
12. The Registration Number of your Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children iswhich may please be noted and quoted for further correspondence.
13. The renewal of registration of the organization to be ensured and adopted the procedure enlisted in the rule of procedure for regulating Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for children.

ANNEXURE - I

Standards of Care scale for Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children

The following norms and standards of care are normally prescribed in Child Care Institutions; it is desirable that the same could be followed wherever possible as best practice.

1. **Physical infrastructure.** -

- i. While children of both genders below 10 years may be kept in the same home, separate bathing and sleeping facilities shall be maintained for boys and girls in the age group of 6-10 years;
- ii. Boys and girls above the age of 10 years shall be accommodated in separate hostels.
- iii. If hostel is only for boys or only for girls could be accommodated for the age group of 6-18, with separate sleeping facilities for the age group of 6-10 age, 11-14 age, 15-18 age.
- iv. Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College having students above 18 years should have separate residential facilities for children above 18 years.
- v. The warden and superintendent shall be provided with residential space and stay within the institution.
- vi. There shall be proper and non-slippery flooring for preventing accidents.
- vii. The suggested norms for building or accommodation in each institution with 25 children may be as specified by the department/schemes or as under:

- iv. Seasonal fruits shall be provided in a non-repetitive manner in sufficient quantities.
- v. Meal Timing and Menu:

- b) chutneys from Gongura or fresh curry leave or fresh coriander or Coconut and Putnadal etc., dal or vegetable may be issued as a dish;

- vii. extra diet for nourishment like milk, eggs, sugar and fruits shall be issued to the children on the advice of the institution doctor in addition to the regular diet, to gain weight or for other health reasons and for the purpose of calculation of the daily ration, the sick children shall be excluded from the day's strength;

Karnataka State Child Protection Policy – 2016 (Revised – 2023)

Child Rights-Based Protection in Karnataka

Guidelines and Operational Procedures for Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or Colleges for Children under the Karnataka State Child Protection Policy (Summary)

Introduction:

The Karnataka State Government implemented the Child Protection Policy in 2016. As per the directive of the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka in Writ Petition No. 10208/2018 dated 22/07/2020, the policy was revised and implemented from 14.12.2023. The revised policy aligns with the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act – 2015 (Amendment 2021) and other related laws. This policy is periodically reviewed to ensure it remains relevant to the evolving needs of child protection in Karnataka.

The implementation of the Karnataka State Child Protection Policy is mandatory for departments such as Education, Police, Social Welfare, Rural Development and Panchayat Raj, Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare, District Administrations, and all concerned agencies and institutions.

State's Perspective:

The Government of Karnataka believes that recognizing and upholding all rights of every child is essential for the country's development. With a rights-based approach, the State is committed to child protection, promoting children's right to participation, safety, and well-being within the legal framework. Every child in the State must be protected regardless of gender, citizenship, religion, caste, economic, social, political, cultural, or geographic status.

It is the State's responsibility to ensure child protection services—especially in social sectors like welfare, education, health, safety, and justice—are accessible and effective for all children.

Karnataka establishes child-centric laws, policies, institutions, and procedures to protect every child's right to live and grow with equality, dignity, safety, and freedom. The policy also aims to prevent customs, traditions, or religious practices that violate or restrict children's rights.

State's Mission:

The State is committed to protecting the legal rights of all children below 18 years. Special attention is given to:

- Children at risk
- Girls
- Sexual minority children
- Children with disabilities
- Minority children
- Victims of sexual abuse, child marriage, labour and cyber crime
- Migrant children

- Children affected by disasters and deadly diseases

The State ensures mechanisms for children to express their opinions and encourages adult-child communication. Legal and policy reforms are adopted to strengthen child protection, and the use of technology and IT is promoted in areas of skill development, planning, budgeting, and monitoring.

The State will act to prevent all forms of physical, emotional abuse, violence, exploitation, and neglect through the Child Protection Policy.

Accordingly, the following actions are prioritized:

- Identifying and addressing existing challenges in the child protection system
- Establishing institutional and foundational mechanisms
- Enhancing inter-departmental and multi-level collaboration

Major Challenges:

- Lack of awareness about child protection systems, roles of stakeholders, and international conventions
- Inadequate data on violence occurring in homes and nearby environments
- Failure to recognize the need for tailored child protection approaches
- Lack of preparedness to handle threats to children
- Lack of coordinated response systems during disasters affecting children's safety, care, and hygiene
- Displacement of children due to large-scale migration or natural/man-made disasters
- Shortage of experienced, trained human resources in child protection systems
- Insufficient resource allocation and high costs
- Weak enforcement of child protection laws
- Lack of child-friendly legal systems
- Increased violence against children due to unregulated digital/internet usage

The State aims to address these challenges through inter-departmental cooperation and institutional networking.

Core Principles of the Karnataka State Child Protection Policy:

1. Every child has universal, indivisible, and inalienable human rights
2. Principles of dignity and freedom
3. Interdependence and interconnection of child rights
4. Every child has the right to survival, protection, development, and participation
5. These rights must be implemented beyond physical existence
6. Holistic approach to mental, emotional, social, and cultural development
7. Ensuring confidentiality of child-related activities and identity
8. Equal rights for all children without discrimination
9. Principle of best interest of the child
10. Primary responsibility of care lies with the parents
11. Principle of upbringing in a family/family-like environment

12. Principle of innocence
13. Principle of innovation and starting anew
14. Institutionalization as a last resort
15. No denial of rights
16. Safety and protection as top priorities
17. Principle of child participation
18. Principle of natural justice
19. Avoidance of harmful language
20. Respect for all children's voices and opinions

Key Objectives:

1. Develop effective, child-centred child protection policies/systems
2. Strengthen the capacities of law enforcement and institutions for child-friendly care and protection
3. Promote inter-departmental and institutional cooperation and transparency
4. Ensure adequate resources and promote their efficient use
5. Use appropriate technologies for effective implementation

The government's foremost responsibility is to prevent all forms of violence, exploitation, neglect, and discrimination against children, and to create a protective environment for every child.

Scope of the Policy:

This policy applies to all individuals, departments, officers, staff, institutions, Hostels, legal entities, NGOs, and others working directly or indirectly with children under 18 years of age in Karnataka. The State bears full responsibility for the safety and protection of all such children—whether in government or private educational institutions, Hostels or any other situation.

Policy Framework:

- Care and protection of children within families
- Care and protection of children in educational institutions:
 1. Ensuring free, quality, equitable education for all children
 2. Protection from discrimination, violence, and abuse
- Community and public space-based care and protection
- Strengthening justice systems for children
- Role of media and children

- Rehabilitation and reintegration of rescued children
- Children in conflict or disaster situations
- Children with disabilities and terminal illnesses
- Homeless children
- Gender identity rights of children
- Children in or at risk of child marriage
- Children and technology in public policy

Compliance:

Child-friendly administrative processes must be the core of protection strategies.

Accountability: Failure to implement the policy will lead to action, including cancellation of institutional recognition and legal proceedings.

Implementation Timeline: Educational institutions must implement the guidelines within 6–12 months. Failure to comply may result in cancellation of recognition or legal action.

Note:

As per the Karnataka State Child Protection Policy – 2016 (Revised 2023), Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children must develop their own child protection policies aligned with the vision, mission, challenges, principles, and objectives. These should be approved by the local Taluk Officer or District Senior Officer and implemented within the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children.

All staff must sign an endorsement form and the head of the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children should maintain this documentation.

Staff Declaration Requirement:

According to Chapter 5, Annexure-2, Page 103, Serial No. 20 of the revised policy, all staff involved with children (in the Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children) must sign an endorsement form affirming adherence to the Child Protection Policy.

Instructions:

1. Heads of institutions must ensure all staff sign the declaration every two years (or sooner, if changes occur).
2. The institution's full name must appear on the declaration.
3. The policy applies to all Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children under 18—regardless of government or private management.
4. Applies to institutions under all authorities—State, Central, aided, unaided, private, semi-government, voluntary, ICSE/CBSE, etc.

Appendix II
Key Actions to be taken for the Implementation of KSCPP

Key Actions to be Taken for the Implementation of Karnataka State Child Protection Policy 2016 (Revised 2023) in Stand-Alone Hostels for Children in Karnataka:

1. **Formulation and Implementation of Child Protection Policy:** Based on the guidelines and standards of the Karnataka State Child Protection Policy-2016 (Revised in 2023), every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children should formulate a "Child Protection Policy," get it approved by the Deputy Commissioner and implement it in their institution through their department's taluk/district-level officers/if it is NGO/CBO/Privet/Individual/any other hostel DCPU.(details are in annexure – 1)
2. **Display of Child Helpline Number:** The Childline / Child Helpline Number "1098/112" must be mandatorily and prominently displayed on the walls of every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children in a permanent and quality manner. (please refer annexure – 6)
3. **Training on Child Rights and Protection Laws:** Every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children must conduct training programs on:
 - o Child Rights, Child Protection and Mission Vathsalya Scheme
 - o The Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act – 1986 (Amendment 2016)
 - o The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act – 2006 (Karnataka Amendment 2016)
 - o The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act – 2015 (Amendment 2021)
 - o Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act – 2012 (Amendment 2019)
 - o Personal safety, Safe touch and unsafe touch, Life skill education, gender sensitization,
 - o Disaster management and grievance redressal
 - o Connection to social security schemes

In addition, an endorsement form must be obtained from all children stating: *"I will stay free from all forms of abuse, deception through online and social media, drug addiction, and all threatening activities. I will build my knowledge and capacity on cyber safety and resist all such harms. I will not fall into the trap of child marriage or child/adolescent labour. If I witness any such incident, I will bravely report it to the concerned authorities."*

4. **Formation of Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College Child Protection Committee (CPC):** A Child Protection Committee must be formed in every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children and made operational. (CPC members list in annexure – 1)

5. **Quarterly Committee Meetings and Record Maintenance:** The CPC must meet once every three months (four times a year), and maintain a proper proceedings register. This record must be mandatorily maintained.
6. **Endorsement form from all children:** taking endorsement form from each child/student and their parents. (Please refer the annexure 3)
7. **Collection of endorsement form from Staff:** A signed endorsement form must be collected from each staff member. (If there are amendments every 2 years, the new endorsement form must be signed again and properly filed). This file must be compulsorily maintained. (Please refer the annexure 4)
8. **Installation of Suggestion/Complaint Boxes for Children:** Suggestion/Complaint boxes must be installed in every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children such that they are easily accessible to children. One box should be installed for every 75 children.
9. **Weekly Review of Complaint Boxes:** Complaints must be reviewed weekly by members of the Child Protection Committee (including mandatory participation of child representatives), accepted respectfully, and resolved sincerely. If the complaint pertains to another department, it must be referred accordingly.
10. **Documentation and Confidentiality of Complaints:** A register must be maintained detailing the actions taken on complaints received through the boxes. The children's letters should be affixed to separate A4 sheets and stored in a separate file. While recording action taken in the register, the name of the child must not be entered. Only a serial number from the letter should be mentioned.
11. **Formation of 'Children's Rights Clubs':** Every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children must mandatorily form a Children's Rights Club and ensure its active functioning. A separate register should be maintained for the same.
12. **Participation in Panchayat/Ward Meetings:** Every Stand-Alone Hostel, Hostels of Educational Institutions and Residential Schools or College for children must encourage children's participation in annual Gram/Ward Sabhas (Village Assemblies on Child Rights) and in the quarterly meetings of the "Women and Child Protection Committee" at the Gram Panchayat/Ward level. This enables children to express their views, suggestions, and opinions.
13. **Monthly Special Programs:** Institutions must organize at least one special program per month to empower children through knowledge acquisition and strengthen the systems that allow them to express their views, opinions, suggestions, and complaints.
