NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 14 of the Karnataka Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 (Karnataka Act 37 of 1984), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules, namely:

RULES

1. **Title, commencement and application.**-(1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Conduct of Entrance Test for selection and admission to Post Graduate Medical and Dental degree and Diploma courses Rules, 2006.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

(3) They shall apply for selection of candidates for admission to the Post Graduate Medical and Dental degree and Diploma courses.

2. **Definitions.** In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "Autonomous Institutions" means institutions established by the societies, owned, controlled by the State Government and registered under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act, 1960;

(b) "Committee" means the Entrance Test Committee constituted under rule 5;

(c) "Entrance Test" means the Entrance Test referred to in rule 3 for selection of candidates for admission to Government seats in Post Graduate Medical and Dental degree and Diploma courses;

(d) "Government" means the Government of Karnataka;

(e) "Government Medical or Dental College" means a college imparting education in Medicine or Dental Science in Post Graduate degree owned and managed by the Government or an autonomous institution of a society established by the Government;

(f) "Government Seats" means all the seats (excluding All India quota seats) in Post Graduate degree and Diploma courses in Medicine or Dental Science in Government Medical or Dental Colleges and includes such number of seats available to the State Government in Private

Medical Colleges and Dental College or Post Graduate Medical and Dental seats in Deemed Universities as mutually agreed upon for being filled up by it in accordance with these rules;

(ii) Institutions of higher learning imparting education in Health & Family Welfare Services, the Health & Family Welfare Services, Employees' State Insurance, Medical Services, Police Services, Boards and Corporations Services and Institutions which are granted autonomous status including the persons deputed from such Institutions for their services;

(iii) Institutions of higher learning which are not included in the Entrance Test.

(j) "Private College" means a college imparting Medical Education in either Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree and Diploma owned and managed by any person without any grant-in-aid or any kind of aid by the Government;

(k) "Private Dental College" means a college imparting Dental Education in Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree owned and managed by any person without any grant-in-aid or any kind of aid by the Government;

(l) "University" means the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka;

(m) "Deemed University" means any institution declared as having 'Deemed to be University' status by Higher Education Commission and Government of India and are located in the State of Karnataka.

3. Entrance Test: (1) For the purpose of selection of candidates and determination of merit, an Entrance Test shall be conducted by the Entrance Test Committee for the candidates seeking admission to the Post Graduate degree and Diploma courses in Medical Sciences and Post Graduate degree in Dental Sciences including the seats reserved for in-service candidates.

(2) In-service candidate who has completed three years of regular service and successfully completed the probationary period, as on the last date of receipt of applications for the Entrance Test, shall apply through the proper channel only through concerned Head of the Department i.e. Director of Medical Education/Director of Health and Family Welfare Services/Director, ESIF/Heads of Autonomous Institutions/Heads of Boards and Corporations, as the case may be.

4. Eligibility: (1) A candidate who fulfil the following criteria shall be eligible to appear for the Entrance Test:-

(a) Indian citizen or India

(b) He/she should have obtained in the entrance leading to the award of MBBS/BDS Degree in colleges established by Medical Council of India/Board of Council of India Government of India established by law and located in Karnataka State or

(c) Candidate must be of Karnataka origin who has studied MBBS/BDS degrees in colleges outside Karnataka recognized by Medical Council of India/Dental Council of India and Government of India and affiliated to any University established by law in India.

Explanation: "Candidates of Karnataka origin" means who or his parents (father or mother) has been a resident of Karnataka State for a period of not less than ten years, and who produces a certificate from the concerned Tahsildar to that effect.

(d) He/she has completed or is completing compulsory rotating internship on or before 30th April of the year in which application for entrance test is called for subject to completion of internship course.

(e) A candidate who is already holding a Post Graduate degree in any speciality, shall not be eligible to appear for test for admission to any Post Graduate degree or Diploma course.

(f) Must be less than 45 years of age on the day of admission to Post graduate course.

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Provided that the requirements mentioned under rule 4 (c) shall not be applicable in the case of:-

- (a) The children of serving or retired employees of All India Services, Karnataka cadre of the State Government or who served or are serving outside that State during the period the candidate had been studying up to the first standard in the Karnataka of the first year of the course leading to the degree in the qualifying examination, to the extent of the period of such service outside the state.
 - (b) Children of Central Government employees and employees of Central or State Government undertakings or Joint Sector working continuously in Karnataka for at least three years as on the 30th April of that year.
 - (c) Children of Central Government employees and employees of Central or State Government undertakings or Joint Sector undertakings working as on the 30th April of that year outside the state, where such employee had:
 - (i) declared to the respective Government Organisation a place in Karnataka as his home town; and
 - (ii) studied for not less than five years between the First Standard and SSLC or equivalent examination in any educational institution in Karnataka run or recognized by the State Government.
 - (d) The children of Members of Parliament elected from the Karnataka to the extent of the period of being a Member of Parliament during the period of the child's study in New Delhi from the First Standard to the 10th standard during the tenure as Member of Parliament.
 - (e) The children of serving Defence Personnel or Ex-servicemen whose address at the time of joining the Defence Service is in Karnataka.
- Note: (i) Child: for the purpose of the rule means natural born son or daughter and not adopted son or daughter and not grandson or granddaughter.
- (ii) The candidates claiming any of the exemption specified above shall produce such certificates as specified by the committee for claiming such exemption.

5. Entrance Test Committee: (1) Subject to provisions of these rules, there shall be an Entrance Test Committee consisting of the following, namely:-

(2) The committee may co-opt two more members. The duration of members of co-opted members shall be restricted to the annual Entrance Test of respective year only.

4. The committee shall draw the merit list prepared in accordance with the Ordinance to the

5. Reservation of seats - Orders issued by the Government from time to time for reservation in

6. The seats in the courses shall be classified as hereunder -

- (1) Government seats.
- (2) Management seats.

(2) All the Government seats shall be filled by the Committee under these rules through counselling.

(3) The seats classified as management seats shall be filled by the managements of Private Medical Colleges and Dental Colleges on the basis of merit determined by conducting Common Entrance test conducted by the Association of managements of private medical and dental colleges or by the Entrance Test Committee constituted under rule 3. The Entrance Test Committee shall oversee that the examinations conducted by the managements are conducted in a fair and transparent manner. The Government seats as are remaining unfilled after the last date prescribed by the University for admission.

8. Selection committee - The Government shall constitute a Selection Committee consisting of the following for allocation of seats for admission of candidates including in-service candidates, based on the merit list prepared in accordance with rule 5, namely:-

9. Verification of certificates submitted in application of candidates - The certificates produced by any candidate shall be verified by the appropriate authority. The selection committee may refuse to consider the application of any candidate if he does not avail the opportunity of being heard in the

10. Procedure for admission of in-service candidates for admission to Post graduate Medical and Dental courses - The procedure for admission of in-service candidates for admission to Post graduate Degree and Diploma in Medical and Dental courses is as follows:

- (1) No in-service candidate shall be eligible for admission under these rules:
 - (a) unless he has put in not less than three years of regular service;
 - (b) unless he has satisfactorily completed the prescribed period of probation.
- (2) No in-service candidate shall be eligible for admission to Post graduate degree and Diploma courses in any subject other than the Speciality in which he is working.
- (3) An in-service candidate who is already holding a Post Graduate degree in any speciality shall not be eligible for admission to any other Post Graduate degree or Diploma.
- (4) An in-service candidate who is already holding a Post graduate Diploma in any speciality through Government deputation, shall be eligible for admission to Post graduate degree

courses in the same speciality and shall not be eligible for any other Post graduate Degree or Diploma courses.

- (5) An in-service candidate who is studying in any Post graduate degree or Diploma course shall not be eligible for admission under these rules.
- (6) No candidate who is above forty-eight years of age as on the last date fixed for receipt of application shall be eligible for admission.

11. Distribution of seats. - (1) Out of total number of Government seats, the Government shall notify the number of seats to be reserved for in-service candidates.

(2) Any seats reserved for in-service candidates which remain un-filled for want of eligible candidate or otherwise shall be added to the non in-service quota seats.

12. Reservation of seats for in-service candidates. - (1) Out of the total number of seats available for in-service candidates,

(a) fifteen percent of seats shall be reserved for persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes;

(b) three percent shall be reserved for persons belonging to the Scheduled Tribes.

13. List of selected candidates. - A list of the candidates selected for each of the colleges together with their applications and other connected papers shall be forwarded to the Principals of the concerned colleges to which such candidates are allotted. The list shall be published on the notice board of the Raji Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bangalore.

14. Admission of selected candidates. - (1) The selected candidates shall get themselves admitted to the colleges allotted within the dates notified by the selection committee, failing which their selection shall stand automatically cancelled. However, the admission shall be provisional and subject to the approval of the concerned Universities.

(2) The Principals of respective colleges shall also verify the original certificates of selected candidates before admitting them to the courses.

(3) No request for change of subjects or courses or colleges shall be entertained by the Selection Committee after publication of the list under these rules.

15. Forfeiture of seats. - (1) Every candidate including in-service candidate shall pay a sum of Rs.10,000/- for Degree and Rs.5,000/- for Diploma to the Government in case he takes allotment order during counselling and fails to join the course.

(2) All the selected candidates except in-service candidate at the time of admission shall furnish a bond on a stamped paper of Rs.100/- binding himself to pay a sum Rs.50,000/- in case of Degree and Rs.25,000/- in case of Diploma along with the stipendary amount received by him in the event of leaving the course before its completion.

(3) All the selected in-service candidates at the time of admission shall furnish a bond in the form specified by the committee on stamp paper of value of Rs.100/- binding himself to pay a sum of Rs.50,000/- for Degree and Rs.25,000/- for Diploma courses as penalty in the event of his leaving the course before its completion and also debarred for three years from appearing entrance test. All the selected in-service candidates at the time of admission shall furnish a bond to the effect that they will be rendering service in the Government for a minimum period of ten years or till the attainment of superannuation, whichever is earlier.

(4) Every candidate shall pay the remaining period course fee to the Government/ Private colleges in the event he leaving the course before its completion:

Provided that in case of an in-service candidate, the amount equal to the fee for remaining period of course shall be recovered from the salary of such in-service candidate.

(5) Candidates selecting Government Colleges and Government seats in Private colleges (under concession fee) for Post Graduate courses shall furnish an undertaking that he will serve the Government for a period of three years after completion of the course, if Government desires.

(6) Candidates who shall not furnish an undertaking to the Government shall furnish an undertaking to the Government for a period of three years, if Government desires.

(7) A penalty of Rs. 5,00,000/- for degree and Rs. 3,00,000/- for Diploma shall be levied in case the candidate fail to serve the Government after completion of the course as per the undertaking.

16. **Determination of fees.** - The fee for the courses under these rules for Government seats shall be fixed by notification, by Government. The fee in respect of management seats shall be determined by the Government by notification. Different rate of fee may be fixed for different categories of students and different categories of institutions. Any college aggrieved by such determination may appeal to the Government within thirty days from the date of such notification.

17. **Reconciliation meeting.** - After the closing date for allotment as fixed by the Government is over, a reconciliation meeting regarding the number of unfilled and un-allotted seats, shall be held between the Director of Medical Education and the respective private colleges. After identifying the vacant seats notification shall be issued regarding such vacant seats by the Director. Such seats, if any, thereafter shall be filled by the respective colleges, within the date stipulated by the University. Such reconciliation meeting shall be held at least seven days before the last date of admission fixed by the University.

18. **General.** - (1) There shall be an application form, registration fee and an admission ticket for entrance test, as may be specified by the committee.

(2) The entrance test shall be conducted at the centres notified by the Committee. The candidates shall appear for the entrance test at the centres specified by the committee, at their own cost.

(3) Each candidate shall be given a registration number, which shall be entered in the application form.

(4) The cost of application form and the registration fee for the entrance test shall be as fixed by the committee from time to time. The amount so collected shall be deposited in any of the nationalized bank by opening an account in the name of the Committee. The Chairman and Member-Secretary shall be authorized to operate such account on behalf of the committee to meet the expenses incurred in connection with the conduct of entrance test and counselling of allotment of seats by the selection committee.

(5) In all matters pertaining to the conduct of entrance test, the decision of the Entrance Test committee shall be final, subject to revision by the Government.

(6) The Member-Secretary shall be responsible to maintain the records of all the proceedings and the resolutions of the meetings convened by the Committee in a separate register kept for the purpose.

(7) The accounts of income and expenditure connected with the entrance test shall be audited by the State Accounts Department within three months after the announcement of result of the entrance test and it shall send a copy of such audit report for the approval of the Government.

19. **Repeal and savings.** - The Karnataka Conduct of Entrance Test for admission to Post Graduate Medical and Dental Degree and Diploma Courses Rules, 2003 are hereby repealed.

Provided that the said repeal shall not affect the previous operation of the said rules or anything duly done or suffered thereunder or affect any right, liability or obligation acquired, accrued or incurred under the said rules.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Karnataka Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 (Karnataka Act 37 of 1984), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules, namely:-

1. Title, commencement and application - (1) These Rules may be called the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006.
- (2) They shall come into force from date of their publication in Official Gazette.
- (3) They shall apply to the selection of candidates for admission to the following professional educational courses, namely:-
 - (A) in Medical and Dental Institutions, to the first year of
 - (a) Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery and
 - (b) Bachelor of Dental Surgery
 - (B) In the Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy Institutions to the first year of
 - (a) Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery
 - (b) Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery
 - (c) Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yoga and
 - (d) Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery
 - (C) In Engineering Institutions, to the First Year, First Semester and in respect of Diploma holders to the Second Year, Third Semester (in the case of Architecture course First Year, First Semester) of both full-time and part-time courses in
 - (a) Bachelor of Engineering
 - (b) Bachelor of Technology and
 - (c) Bachelor of Architecture

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(b) has passed the second year Pre-University or XII standard or equivalent examinations held preceding the Entrance test,-

(I) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages and has secured not less than fifty percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects and has secured not less than fifty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Entrance Test, for admission to Medical and Dental courses.

(II) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages and has secured not less than fifty percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects for admission to Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy.

(III) with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects, along with one of the following subjects: - Chemistry, Bio-Technology, Computer Science, Biology, Electronics and has secured not less than forty five percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects with English as one of the languages for admission to Engineering and Technology courses.

Provided that the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty percent of the aggregate in optional subjects and forty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in Entrance Test in case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government Order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Medical and Dental courses.

Provided further that, the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty percent of aggregate in optional subjects in case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government Order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy, Engineering and Technology courses.

(c) has completed 17 years of age as on 31st December of the year of admission, for admission to Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses.

Provided that no candidate who has obtained a seat in any discipline through the CET Cell in any previous year shall be eligible to appear for the Common Entrance Test conducted by the CET Cell for selection of a seat in the same discipline.

(2) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to full time degree course in Architecture unless,-

(a) he has appeared for the aptitude Test Part-I and II conducted by CET Cell; and

(b) has passed the Pre-University examination or equivalent examination held preceding the entrance test with Mathematics and English as subjects and has secured fifty percent of the aggregate marks in all subjects and has appeared for an Aptitude Test conducted by the CET Cell and has secured not less than forty percent of marks taken together in both part-I & II of the Aptitude test, for admission to Architecture course.

(3) A candidate shall be eligible for admission to any of the full-time degree courses specified in clause (C) of sub rule (3) of rule 1, if he has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted under rule 17 and is the holder of a diploma in the appropriate branch of engineering specified in SCHEDULE-I, awarded by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka or equivalent qualification and has secured not less than forty percent of marks in the final year examination in the fifth and sixth semesters in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes and has secured not less than forty five percent of marks in respect of others;

Provided that in respect of Architecture the candidate must have secured not less than fifty percent of the marks in the final year Diploma examination and appeared for Aptitude test conducted under Rule 17.

(4) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to part-time course in Second Year, Third Semester of Bachelor's degree in Engineering and Technology, unless he-

(a) has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted under rule 17;

(b) is a holder of a 'Diploma' in appropriate branch of Engineering specified in Schedule-I granted by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka and has secured not less than forty percent of marks in the final year examination in the fifth and sixth semesters in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes and has secured not less than forty five percent of marks in respect of others; and

(c) has on the first September of the year of admission not less than one-year's professional experience in the branch of Engineering/Technology, in which the candidate holds a diploma, after passing diploma course.

Explanation: Professional experience means employed on a regular basis

(a) In Government, Government undertaking, Public Sector undertaking, Corporation or

(b) In a private company registered under the Directorate of Industries and Commerce or the Directorate of Small Scale Industries or

(c) In Government, Government recognised institutions as technical staff.

Provided that the period of apprenticeship undergone shall also be treated as professional experience, if sponsored by the Board of Apprenticeship Training, Southern Region, Chennai or by Government, Government undertakings and Public sector undertakings.

Provided further that employment shall be in an establishment situated within the Urban Agglomeration of the city in which the professional institution is situated.

(4) Determination of merit - (1) The merit of a candidate eligible for admission to the courses under these Rules, shall be determined as follows :

(a) In respect of Medical and Dental courses, with reference to the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Common Entrance Test only.

(b) In respect of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses with reference to the marks obtained in the entrance test and marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the qualifying examination taken in equal proportions.

(c) In respect of Engineering and Technology courses, with reference to the marks obtained in the Entrance Test and the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects in the qualifying examination, taken in equal proportions.

Provided that where the merit of two or more candidates is the same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the Common Entrance Test in Biology in the case of Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses and in Mathematics in the case of Engineering and Technology courses and where the marks obtained in such cases are equal then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in Chemistry in the case of Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses and in Physics in the case of Engineering and Technology courses and where the marks obtained are equal again the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in respective subjects in the qualifying examination as stipulated above and where marks obtained are equal again, the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate placed above the younger.

Explanation: For the purpose of this Rules, optional subjects means, Physics, Chemistry and Biology for the courses specified in clauses (A) and (B) of sub-rule (3) of rule 1 and Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics for the courses specified in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of clause (C) of sub-rule (3) of rule 1.

(d) In respect of Architecture Course, with reference to the marks obtained in the qualifying examination and the marks obtained in both Part - I & II of the aptitude test, taken in equal proportions.

Provided that where merit of two or more candidates is same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the Aptitude test; where marks obtained in Aptitude test are equal, then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in Mathematics in the qualifying examination and where marks obtained in Mathematics are equal, the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate placed above the younger.

(e) In respect of Diploma holders for full-time and part-time courses in Engineering and Technology merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the final year examination or final two semesters examination leading to Diploma in the relevant branch of Engineering specified in Column (2) of the Schedule-I. (Internal assessment marks count for determination of merit in case of semester students where internal assessment marks are counted for declaring the Diploma result) and on the basis of Entrance Test conducted separately under rule 17, taking the marks obtained in the qualifying examination and Entrance Test in equal proportions.

Provided that where the merit of two or more candidates is the same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to marks obtained in the entrance test and where the marks obtained in such cases are same then the interse merit shall be determined with reference to marks obtained in the Second Year / Third and Fourth Semester marks and where the marks obtained in such cases are same then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks of the first year / first and second semester marks and where the marks obtained in such cases are same then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate shall be placed above the younger.

(f) In respect of Diploma holders for full-time Architecture Course merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in the final year examination or final two semesters examination leading to Diploma in the relevant branch of Engineering specified in column (2) of Schedule-I. (Internal assessment marks count for determination of merit in case of semester students where internal assessment marks are counted for declaring the Diploma result) and on the basis of the marks obtained in the Aptitude Test conducted by the CET Cell taking the marks obtained in the qualifying examination and the Aptitude Test in equal proportions.

Provided that where the merit of two or more candidates is same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the aptitude test and where marks obtained is equal, then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in Second Year, Third and Fourth semester and where the marks obtained are equal then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in First Year, First and Second semester and where the marks obtained are equal again then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate shall be placed above the younger.

(2) The interse merit determined for Government seats under sub-rule (1) shall be the basis for the merit list of candidates claiming benefit of reservation under rule 9.

Note: Everything being equal as specified in the provisos to clauses (a) (b) and (c) of sub-rule (1), then the interse merit shall be determined by draw of lots.

5. Eligibility for Government Seats - (1) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to Government Seats unless he is a citizen of India and satisfies any one of the following conditions, namely:-

(i) who has studied and passed in one or more Government or Government recognized educational institutions located in the State of Karnataka for a minimum period of SEVEN academic years commencing from 1st Standard to II PUC or 12th Standard as on 1st July of the

year in which the Entrance Test is held and must have appeared and passed SSLC or 10th Standard or 12th Standard or equivalent examination from institutions located in the state of Karnataka :

Provided that in the case of a candidate who takes more than one year to pass a class or standard, the years of academic study is counted as one year only.

(ii) who has studied and passed I and II year Pre-University Examination or equivalent examination, within the State of Karnataka from an educational institution run or recognised by the State Government and either of his parents must have studied in an educational institution run or recognised by the state Government and located in the State of Karnataka for a minimum period of SEVEN years.

(iii) who is a Horanadu Kannadiga :

Provided that the candidate shall appear for a simple Kannada language test conducted by the CET Cell to prove his or her ability to speak, read and write Kannada.

(iv) who is a Gadinaru Kannadiga :

Provided that the candidate shall appear for a simple Kannada language test conducted by the CET Cell to prove his or her ability to speak, read and write Kannada.

(v) whose parent is a defence personnel who has worked continuously in Karnataka for a minimum period of one year from 1st July of the previous year to 30th June of the year of admission and the candidate must have studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised institutions located in Karnataka.

(vi) whose parent is a serving defence personnel, who at the time of joining the defence service had declared the hometown as a place in the State of Karnataka, proof of such domicile having been produced by obtaining the extract from the Record Office of the Defence Unit.

(vii) whose parent is a defence personnel who had served in Karnataka for at least one year and is posted on duty directly to the disturbed areas of Jammu and Kashmir or North-East and whose family is permitted by the Defence Authorities to continue to stay in Karnataka and such candidate has studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised institution located in Karnataka.

(viii) whose parent is an Ex-Serviceman, who at the time of joining the defence service had declared a place in Karnataka as the hometown, proof of such domicile having been produced from the Rajya Sainik Welfare Board.

(ix) whose parent is an employee of the Union or Karnataka State Government undertaking or a joint Sector undertaking, is liable to transfer anywhere in India as per terms and conditions of employment, has worked continuously for at least one year in Karnataka from 1st July of the previous year to 30th June of the year of admission and such candidate has studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised educational institution located in Karnataka.

(x) whose parent is a working or retired employee of the Union Government or employee of Union or Karnataka State Government undertaking or Joint Sector undertaking where such employee,-

- (a) had declared to the employer at the time of joining any place in Karnataka to be his hometown; and
- (b) had studied in any Government or Government recognised educational institutions located in Karnataka for not less than seven years; and
- (c) was or is liable for transfer anywhere in India as per the terms and conditions of employment.

(xi) whose parent is a Member of Parliament elected from Karnataka.

(xii) whose parent is a serving or retired employee

(a) belonging to All India Service of Karnataka cadre or

(b) of the Government of Karnataka who has served or is serving outside the State of Karnataka, during the period corresponding to the candidate's study outside the state from 1st standard to II PUC or 12th Standard examination.

(xiii) whose parent is a Jammu and Kashmir migrant, proof of such migration shall be produced from the jurisdictional District Magistrate and Deputy Commissioner of any state in India.

Provided that such candidate shall satisfy the academic eligibility specified in rule 3, in order to become eligible for admission to the seats reserved for the wards of Jammu and Kashmir migrants.

Provided further that notwithstanding anything contrary contained in this rule, in case of a candidate who is a Diploma holder seeking admission to the third semester, second year, full-time and part-time degree courses mentioned in Schedule-I, he must have

(i) studied and passed final year Diploma as on 1st July of the year in which admission is sought, in one or more Government or Government recognised educational institutions located in the state of Karnataka; and

(ii) studied for seven academic years from 1st standard to final year diploma in one or more Government or Government recognised educational institutions located in the state of Karnataka; or

(iii) either of the parents should have studied in institutions run or recognised by the state Government located in Karnataka for a minimum period of seven years.

8. Constitution of State Common Entrance Test Committee (1) There shall be a State Common Entrance Test Committee consisting of-

(a) Vice Chancellor of either Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences or Vishveshwariah Technological University, nominated by the State Government

CHAIR PERSON

(b) Director of Medical Education

MEMBER

(c) Director of Technical Education

MEMBER

(d) Director of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy

MEMBER

(e) Three persons to be nominated by the Chairperson from among the Principals of aided or unaided colleges

MEMBERS

(i) One from medical colleges

(ii) One from dental colleges

(iii) One from engineering colleges

(f) Special Officer, Common Entrance Test Cell

: MEMBER-SECRETARY

(2) The State Common Entrance Test Committee shall meet at CET Cell. The Chairperson shall preside over the meetings.

(3) The Committee shall conduct the Common Entrance Test.

(4) The Committee shall take decisions from time to time on the following aspects:-

- (a) pattern of question papers, which shall be in English or in Kannada and which shall be of objective type;
- (b) fixing up of maximum marks for each paper;
- (c) fixing up of duration of the test for each of the papers;
- (d) syllabus contents, as far as may be within the syllabus of I and II year Pre-University Course of Karnataka and the questions shall be to elicit the aptitude of the candidate;
- (e) general guidelines and directions in regard to all matters connected with the conduct of the test.

(5) The Committee shall have the power to accord approval on the following matters, namely :-

- (a) location of test centres for conducting the Entrance Test;
- (b) fixing of timetable and calendar of events for conducting the Entrance Test;
- (c) appointment of the Chief Superintendents, Deputy Chief Superintendents and Custodians for each examination centre;
- (d) appointment of supervisors / squad members / route officers and invigilators for each centre of the examination;
- (e) payment of remuneration for different items of work connected with conducting of the Common Entrance Test and the Seat Selection;
- (f) requiring the production of such particulars or documents or papers by the candidates, as may be deemed necessary from time to time;
- (g) preparation and publication of the merit lists of the Entrance Tests for Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy and Engineering, Technology, Architecture courses;
- (h) the expenditure incurred from time to time by the CET Cell;
- (i) approval of the Accounts of CET Cell;
- (j) any other matters as may be referred to it by the Member Secretary, Chairman or Government from time to time.

(6) The Member-Secretary shall act on the instructions of the Committee and shall follow the directions of the Government in discharging the duties in connection with the conduct of Entrance Test. The Member-Secretary shall be the Chief Executive of the State Common Entrance Test and he shall be responsible for conducting of the Entrance Test, Seat Selection and all incidental matters thereto. The Member-Secretary shall have the following powers, namely :-

- (a) printing of application forms, brochure containing instructions to candidates in accordance with the prevailing Admission Rules, admission tickets and various other registers, forms, cards etc;
- (b) publishing the information with regard to the application format, instructions to candidates and other details on the CET website;
- (c) issuing the Notifications regarding the holding of the Common Entrance Test and the later seat selection process;

- (d) sale and receipt of Entrance Test application cum brochure and issuing of admission tickets through schools and colleges where the students are studying or studied 12th standard or qualifying examination in the state of Karnataka and through Speed Post to the candidates from outside the state of Karnataka;
- (e) fixing a minimum of three question paper setters for each subject confidentially, who are in service with a minimum of ten years of teaching experience;
- (f) arrange for printing of question papers with confidential printers of national repute;
- (g) receive and store the sealed confidential bundles in the strong room with personal supervision under police bundo-busth;
- (h) arrange for transport of sealed confidential bundles to the respective District Treasuries for safe storage, with responsible Officers of not below the rank of Class - II under police bundo-busth;
- (i) printing of carbonless OMR answer sheets;
- (j) appointment of examiners for evaluation of answer scripts, if necessary;
- (k) appointment of an Expert Committee for each subject for finalisation of the actual key answers;
- (l) arranging for computerisation of data relating to the conduct of the Entrance Test, evaluation of the answers, application of key answers approved by the Expert Committee, determination of order of merit of the candidates, fixing the seat selection schedule, holding of the seat selection, issue of admission orders to the candidates, transfer of fee amount to the respective colleges and Universities as per the final approval list issued by the concerned Universities, etc.
- (m) payment of remuneration to the personnel engaged in matters relating to the conduct of Entrance Test, Seat Selection and maintaining of accounts;
- (n) custody and maintenance of records of the Entrance Test and allotment process.

(7) The Special Officer shall :-

- (i) be the Chief Executive of the CET Cell;
- (ii) outsource various tasks of CET Cell to the private agencies;
- (iii) exercise administrative, disciplinary control over the personnel of CET Cell and personnel engaged on contract basis;
- (iv) operate the Bank Accounts;
- (v) maintain books of accounts and other records;
- (vi) delegate duties and responsibilities to the staff;
- (vii) upon completion of the Entrance Test, Seat Selection and allotment, order disposal of the records of the Entrance Test, Seat Selection and seat allotment and other records of the previous years;
- (viii) Issue of Admission Orders and related records to the candidates under his signature and office seal;
- (ix) Inquire into matters of allegations of malpractice, if any, during the period of the Entrance Test committed either by the candidates or personnel engaged as invigilators, Custodians, Observers, Deputy Chief Superintendent and personnel engaged in the matter of evaluation of answer scripts, matters relating to computerisation of Common Entrance Test data, personnel engaged in the matter of determination of merit order, rank, publications

thereto, verification and acceptance of the records produced by the candidates or by their parents, selection of seats and issue of Admission Orders, refund of admission fee, etc.

(8) The Deputy Commissioner of the District shall be the Chief Superintendent for all the Entrance Test centres in the District. The Deputy Commissioner shall be in charge of matters relating to the conduct of the Entrance Test. The Deputy Chief Superintendent at each centre appointed by the State Common Entrance Test Committee shall assist the Chief Superintendent. The Deputy Commissioner cum Chief Superintendent, shall be responsible for :-

- (a) appointing Observers not below the rank of an Assistant Commissioner for each centre, who shall report the irregularities, etc., if any, noticed at the examination centre to the Deputy Commissioner;
- (b) arranging the receipt and dispatch of the sealed packets of question papers, OMR answer sheets, their security, secrecy, safety and their safe storage in the District Treasury or Sub-Treasury;
- (c) arranging the physical facilities required for the conduct of the Entrance Test;
- (d) arranging for the conduct of the Entrance Test as per the directions and schedule notified by the Committee;
- (e) constituting a Committee of three officers not below the rank of Grade-B, for the following purpose, namely:-
 - (i) To receive the sealed bundles containing question papers and OMR answer sheets from the Route Officers appointed by the Member-Secretary;
 - (ii) Storage of such sealed bundles at the District Treasury, Sub-Treasury;
 - (iii) Providing sufficient police bundo-busth at each of the exam center in the district and also for the officers appointed for carrying the sealed confidential bundles on both days of the test;
 - (iv) Handing over of the sealed bundles of Question Paper, OMR answer sheet, to the Deputy Chief-Superintendent / Principal of the test centre on the day of the test;
 - (v) Collection of the sealed bundles containing used, unused OMR answer sheets and unused question papers from the test centres after completion of the Entrance Test on both days and their safe storage at the District Treasury, Sub-Treasury;
 - (vi) Handing over the sealed bundles containing used and unused OMR answer sheets and unused question papers to the designated Officer appointed by the Member-Secretary;
 - (vii) Such other duties and responsibilities as are required to be carried out from time to time.
- (f) Such other matters as may be entrusted or required by the Special Officer.

(9) Duties of Deputy Chief Superintendents and other staff shall be as may be specified by the Special Officer.

7. Procedure for issue of application for Entrance Test etc. - The procedure for the selection of candidates for admission to Government Seats in professional educational institutions shall be as follows, namely:-

(k) 'Government' means, the Government of Karnataka.

(l) 'Government Seats' means all the seats in Government and University colleges, 95% of the seats in aided courses in Private Aided Engineering colleges and 80% of the seats in private aided Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy colleges and such of the seats in unaided, minority and non-minority professional educational institutions filled by the CET cell on the basis of consensus between the Government and the Private Professional Educational Institutions and notified by the Government as Government seats.

(m) 'Horanadu Kannadiga' means, a candidate whose mother tongue is Kannada or Tulu or Kodava and who is residing outside the state of Karnataka; as on 1st May of the year in which the Common Entrance Test is held, such candidate, having passed the qualifying examination from an University or Board or any other institution located outside Karnataka.

(n) 'Indian Systems of Medicine' means, Ayurveda, Naturopathy and Yoga and Unani Systems of Medicine.

(o) 'Institution' means, any professional educational institution or college affiliated to any University and carrying on the activity of imparting education in Medicine, Dentistry, Indian Systems of Medicine, Homoeopathy, Engineering, Technology and Architecture courses.

(p) 'Intake' means, the sanctioned strength of a course in an institution fixed by the competent authority to fix such intake.

(q) 'Merit' means, merit as determined under Rules 4.

(r) 'Other Backward Classes' means, the candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes notified as such under Article 15 of the Constitution by the state Government from time to time.

(s) 'Pre-University Examination' means, the second year Pre-university Examination conducted by the Department of Pre-University Education in the State of Karnataka.

(t) 'Qualifying Examination' means, (i) 2nd year Pre-University Examination or any other qualifying examination, declared as equivalent by the Government, for admission to first year Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery, Bachelor of Dental Surgery, Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery, Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yoga, Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery and Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery, Bachelor of Engineering, Bachelor of Technology and Bachelor of Architecture courses.

(u) 'Three Years Diploma Examination of the Board of Technical Examination' in Karnataka or any other qualifying examination, declared as equivalent by the Government, for admission to Second Year, Third Semester of Bachelor of Engineering, Bachelor of Technology, First Year, First Semester Bachelor of Architecture, in full-time and part-time degree courses.

(v) 'Schedule' means a Schedule appended to these Rules.

(w) 'Seat Matrix' means, statements showing college-wise, course-wise and category-wise break-up of seats as notified by Government for the academic year.

(x) 'Special Officer' means, an Officer belonging to Indian Administrative Service, appointed by the Government, in connection with conduct of Common Entrance Test and regulation of all matters pertaining to seat selection and admission to the courses.

(y) 'Unaided institution' means, any privately managed institution, which is not receiving Grant-in-Aid from the Government.

3. Academic Eligibility - (1) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to any of the full time degree courses specified in sub-rule (3) of Rule 1 other than the degree course in Architecture, unless he,-

(a) has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Common Entrance Test Cell,

2. Definitions - In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires,

(a) 'Admission Centre' means, the centre at which selection and allotment of candidates to professional courses is done by the CET Cell by centralized counseling based on the merit of the candidates through single window system to Government seats.

(b) 'Aided Institution' means, a private professional educational institution, which receives Grant-in-Aid from the Government, but does not include a course of study, which does not receive Grant-in-Aid in such institution.

(c) 'Candidate' means, an applicant to the Common Entrance Test seeking allotment of a seat in professional educational courses or institutions as per the academic eligibility.

(d) 'Casual Vacancy' means, unfilled, surrendered, forfeited or newly added seat available after completion of the Admission round seat selection.

(e) 'CET Cell' means Common Entrance Test Cell constituted by the State Government at Bangalore.

(f) 'Committee' means, the State Common Entrance Test Committee constituted under sub-rule (1) of rule 6.

(g) 'Director' means, the Director of Technical Education or Director of Medical Education or Director of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy, in Karnataka, as the case may be.

(h) 'Entrance Test' means, the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Committee through the CET Cell or the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Director under rule 17.

(i) 'Ex-Serviceman' means, a person who has served in any rank whether as a combatant in the regular Army, Navy or Air Force of the Indian Union and

(I) who retired from such service after earning his pension; or

(II) who has been released from such service on medical ground attributable to military service or circumstances beyond his control and awarded medical or other disability pension; or

(III) who has been released, otherwise than on his own request, from such service as a result of reduction in establishment; or

(IV) who has been released from such service after completing the specific period of engagement, otherwise than at his own request or by way of dismissal or discharge on account of misconduct or inefficiency and has been given a gratuity, and includes personnel of the territorial army of the following categories, namely:-

(a) pension holders for continuous embodied service;

(b) pension holder with disability attributable to military service

and

(c) gallantry award winners

excluding Defence Security Corps, General Reserve Engineering Force, the Lok Sahayak Sena and the Para Military Territorial Army other than those in sub-clause (iv).

Provided that a person, who has served for not less than five years and was honourably discharged prior to 1st July 1987, shall also be considered as an Ex-serviceman.

(j) 'Gadinadu Kannadiga' means, a candidate whose mother tongue is Kannada (Tulu or Kodava and who resides in Kannada speaking areas of South Sholapur, Akkalakot, Jath or Gedhinga Taluks of Maharashtra State or Kasargod Taluk of Kerala State.

(1) The Special Officer shall publish details regarding the conduct of Entrance Test on the notice board of the CET Cell, on the CET website and in such other places as he deems fit and also by giving publicity in Kannada and English news papers, having wide circulation in the State and call for duly completed application forms for taking the Entrance Test and admission to courses under these Rules.

(2) The Special Officer shall publish on the notice board of the CET Cell and on the CET website, the information with regard to the aided and un-aided institutions and particulars of courses, the number of seats available, the names and location of the institutions, the fees payable, minimum eligibility conditions, reservation of seats, the method of seat selection and such other information, as he may consider necessary, before the commencement of seat selection process. The Special Officer shall notify on the notice board, the certificates, affidavits, marks cards, academic records, eligibility certificate, etc., which shall be required to be produced by the candidates, at the time of Seat Selection.

(3) A candidate, claiming (i) equivalence in qualifying examination, shall produce at the time of Seat Selection, a copy of the order in which such qualification has been declared equivalent to the Karnataka Pre-University Examination or the eligibility certificate issued by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, in the case of applicant for Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine, Homoeopathy courses and by the Vishveshwaraiah Technological University, in the case of applicant for Engineering, Technology and Architecture courses.

(ii) qualification as equivalent to the Diploma conducted by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka, shall produce at the time of Seat Selection, a copy of the eligibility certificate issued by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka.

(4) Application shall be duly filed as per the instructions in the Brochure issued along with the application. Applications received after the last date fixed for receipt of application or incomplete applications shall be rejected without any intimation to the candidate.

(5) Relevant data of the applications shall be stored in the CET Cell.

8. Preparation and publication of merit list - (1) The Member Secretary of the Committee shall prepare the merit list of candidates eligible for selection of Government seats. Separate merit lists for Medical and Dental courses and Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses, and Engineering and Technology and Architecture courses and separate merit list for the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants shall be prepared, in accordance with rule 4 and cause publication of the said lists, on the notice boards of all the CET examination centres and on the CET website.

(2) The Member Secretary shall prepare separate merit lists of eligible candidates referred to in the proviso to clauses (a), (b) & (c) of sub-clause (1) of rule 4.

(3) Mere appearance at the Common Entrance Test or Aptitude Test does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission automatically, unless the candidate fulfills the eligibility conditions required for admission to the course.

9. Reservations applicable to Government seats - (1) There shall be reservations in Government seats for the following categories, the extent of which shall be as specified by the Government from time to time.

(A) The following candidates shall be eligible for selection under NCC category, namely:-

(i) who have participated in Republic Day Camp conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five year period of study in Karnataka between 8th to 12th standards or

(ii) who have participated in the following camps conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th to 12th standards namely

- (a) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Boys)
- (b) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Girls)
- (c) All India Nau Sainik Camp
- (d) All India Vayu Sainik Camp

AND Youth Exchange Programmes and Foreign Naval Cruise

(iii) who have participated in the following camps conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th to 12th standards namely:-

- (a) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Boys)
- (b) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Girls)
- (c) All India Nau Sainik Camp
- (d) All India Vayu Sainik Camp

AND complete - Mountaineering Expeditions (over 5000 Mtrs), Sailing Expeditions using wind power only (401 KMs), Motor Cycle Expeditions (more than 3500 KMs) and Cycling Expeditions (more than 1500 KMs).

(iv) who have participated in the following camps / courses from Karnataka conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi and Dy. DG, NCC Directorate of Karnataka and Goa and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th to 12th standards namely:-

- (a) National Integration Camp
- (b) Trekking camp
- (c) Mountaineering course
- (d) Basic Leadership Course
- (e) Advanced Leadership Course
- (f) Rock Climbing Training Camp
- (g) Army, Navy, Air force and Hospital Attachments

(v) who possess at least 'B' certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th to 12th standard:

~~Provided that for selection of a reserved seat under NCC category, candidates possessing 'B' Certificate and adjudged overall All India BEST CADET with Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the Republic Day camp shall be considered first; 'B' certificate holders who are adjudged overall All India BEST CADET and have won Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the camps mentioned in sub-clause (ii) shall be considered second; 'B' certificate holders who have participated from Karnataka in the Republic Day camp shall be considered third; 'B' Certificate holders who have participated from Karnataka in the camps mentioned in sub-clause (ii) shall be considered fourth; 'B' Certificate holders who have participated from Karnataka in the camps mentioned in sub-clause (iii) shall be considered fifth and 'B' Certificate holders who have participated in the camps mentioned in sub-clause (iv) shall be considered sixth before considering the candidates referred to in sub-clause (v):~~

Provided further that the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v) i.e., only 'B' certificate holders shall be eligible to select the NCC special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and Reserved category candidates as per their merit order:

Provided also that in the case of Diploma candidates, preference shall be given to candidates with NCC 'C' Certificate over candidates with NCC 'B' Certificate:

Provided also that the Director of NCC or his authorized nominee shall be present in the CET Cell on the notified day of NCC seat selection, along with the list of eligible NCC candidates to assist in the selection of candidates under NCC category.

(B) The following candidates shall be eligible for selection under Sports category, namely:-

(i) who have represented the country and won medals/ cups in the SUPER-A Games specified in Schedule-II during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards

(ii) who have represented the country and won medals / cups in 'A - Games' specified in Schedule-II during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards

(iii) who have won medals / cups in 'B-Games' specified in Schedule-II by representing Karnataka State and participated in the SUPER-A Games or A-Games specified in Schedule-II during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;

(iv) who have represented Karnataka State in 'B-Games' specified in Schedule-II and won medals / cups during the five year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;

(v) who have represented Karnataka State in any sports or games in the 'B-Games' specified in schedule-II during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards:

Provided that for selection of a reserved seat in Sports category, the candidates who belong to sub-clause (i) shall be considered first; candidates who belong to sub-clause (ii) shall be considered second; candidates who belong to sub-clause (iii) shall be considered third and candidates who belong to sub-clause (iv) shall be considered fourth before considering the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v).

Provided further that, while considering the candidates mentioned in sub-clauses (i), (ii), (iii) (iv) and (v), Gold medal winners will be preferred to Silver medalist who in turn will be preferred to Bronze medalist under the respective sub-clauses, irrespective of the number of medals.

Provided also that the achievements of the candidates mentioned in sub-clauses (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) must be on or before the date of Common Entrance Test of the relevant year.

Provided also that the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v) i.e., only those who have represented Karnataka State shall be eligible to select the Sports special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and Reserved category candidates as per their merit order.

Provided also that the Commissioner for Youth Services and Sports or his authorized nominee shall be present in the CET Cell on the notified day of Sports seat selection, along with the list of eligible candidates to assist in the selection of candidates under Sports category.

(C) candidates who as Scouts and Guides have received the "President's Award" during five years period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards.

Provided that the candidates shall submit the "President's Award" certificate on the day of general round of seat selection as per their merit order.

Provided further that in case of Diploma holders, period of study shall be reckoned from 8th standard to final year Diploma.

(D) son or daughter of Defence Personnel.

Explanation: Subject to the conditions laid down in clauses (v), (vi) and (vii) of Rules 5, Defence personnel for the purpose of this clause means a person in Defence Service including Personnel belonging to Civil-GT-COYS ASC who were Civilian Class 'III' or Class 'IV' Government servants and Border Roads Organisational Personnel. (Vide Notification No. ED 189 TGL 94 Bangalore dated 29-07-1994).

(E) son or daughter of Ex-Servicemen.

Explanation: Ex-Servicemen for the purpose of this clause includes personnel belonging to Civil GT COYS ASC who were Civilian Class III or Class IV Government Servants, who became permanently disabled or were killed during hostilities.

Provided that in case of Evening colleges, preference shall be given to serving defence personnel and employed ex-defence personnel, over wards of defence and ex-defence personnel.

(F) candidates from Anglo-Indian Community.

(G) candidates who are Persons with Disability.

(r) candidates possessing Diploma in the relevant branch of Engineering Diploma specified in column (2) of Schedule-I at serial number 2 for admission to first year Architecture course.

Note: Candidates belonging to clauses (C) to (F) above shall be allowed to select the respective special category seats as per their merit order in the general round of seat selection along with other general merit and reserved category candidates.

(2) (a) Out of the total number of Government seats available after deducting the total number of seats reserved under sub-clause (1), reservation shall be made in favour of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes, as notified by the Government of Karnataka under categories I, II-A, II-B, III-A, III-B in accordance with Government Order No. SWL 251 BCA 94 dated 31st Jan., 1995 as amended from time to time.

(b) In case of Architecture course, the total number of Government seats in full time courses after deducting ten percent of seats for Diploma holders and the total number of seats reserved under sub-rule (1), reservation shall be made in favour of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes, as notified by the Government of Karnataka under categories I, II-A, II-B, III-A, III-B in accordance with Government Order No. SWL 251 BCA 94 dated 31st Jan., 1995 as amended from time to time.

Provided that no candidate other than those who are claiming eligibility for Government Seats in accordance with clause (i), (ii), (vi), (vii), (x), (xi) and (xii) of Rules 5 shall be eligible to claim the benefit of reservation under this sub-clause.

(3) Fifteen Percent of Government seats shall be reserved horizontally in favour of rural candidates and the eligibility criteria shall be as defined in the Karnataka Reservation of Appointments or Posts in the Civil services of the State for Rural Candidates Act, 2000 (Karnataka Act 1 of 2001).

(4) Five percent of Government seats shall be reserved horizontally for allotment to the candidates who have studied in Kannada Medium from 1st standard to 10th standard in accordance with Government Order No. ED 118 UEC 2000, Bangalore dated 04-06-2000 and as amended vide Government order No. ED 02 UEC 2002, Bangalore dated 14-10-2005.

(5) Interse merit determined under Rules 4 shall remain for availing benefit of reservation under these Rules.

(6) If any seat reserved in favour of candidates belonging to the categories referred to in sub-rule (3) and (4) remains unfilled, such vacant seats shall stand transferred to the respective categories specified in sub-rule (2).

10. Exercising option for selection of Government seats - (1) The candidate shall exercise the option to select the seat of his-choice in the order of merit as follows, namely:

(i) The candidate shall have the option to select a seat from among the available seats displayed using a projector linked to a computer, which is programmed to account for the on-going seat selection, college-wise, course-wise and category-wise as per the seat matrix,

(ii) The candidate shall have the option to select a seat in the discipline to which he is eligible,

(iii) The candidate may choose the course and the institution,

(iv) The candidate while selecting a seat, shall deposit the notified fee, for the first year, first semester, through a crossed Demand Draft, Pay Order, drawn in favour of 'The Special Officer, Common Entrance Test Cell, Bangalore', payable at Bangalore,

(v) The candidate shall produce the specified original documents along with photocopies thereof and the Special Officer may cause verification of the documents produced. The GET Cell shall retain all original documents along with one set of photocopies of the same. After seat selection the Special Officer shall issue admission order to the candidate. The candidate upon obtaining the admission order from the GET Cell, shall report to the college concerned on or before the date specified in the admission order. The original documents in respect of all candidates shall be transferred to the respective colleges after the completion of the entire seat selection.

(vi) The candidate belonging to reserved category, special category shall have the opportunity to select a seat under the general merit category also.

(vii) The candidate seeking selection of reserved category seat under sub-rule (2) of rule 9 shall not be entitled to participate in the seat selection, unless the candidate produces a Caste Certificate in form 'D' in case of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and in form 'E' in case of Category-I and a Caste Income Certificate in form 'F' for other backward classes like 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B, issued by the jurisdictional Tahesildar, in accordance with the Government Order No. Sa Ka E 225 BCA 2002 dated 30th March 2002 as amended from time to time. The candidate shall also produce an affidavit in the format as prescribed in the brochure along with the Caste certificate.

Provided that the candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste, the Scheduled Tribes and Category-I claiming seat under reserved category shall also produce income certificate issued by the jurisdictional Tahesildar.

(viii) The candidate claiming reserved category seat under sub-rule (1) of rule 9, except those claiming reservation under Scouts and Guides and Physical Disability, shall produce the specified original documents in support of the claim, to the Special Officer, who may refer the same to the respective authorities for scrutiny and confirmation, namely,

(a) N.C.C. : To the Directorate of N.C.C. in Karnataka.

(b) Sports : To the Commissioner for Youth Services and Sports in Karnataka.

(c) Defence: The Officiating Education Officer, (HQ), Karnataka, Kerala and Goa sub-Area, Bangalore.

(d) Ex-Serviceman : To the Director, Department of Sainik Welfare and Resettlement in Karnataka.

(e) Anglo-Indian: Nominated Anglo-Indian MLA of State of Karnataka.

(f) The candidate suffering from less than forty percent of disability shall not be eligible for selection of a seat under the persons with disability category. The candidate claiming a seat under the persons with disability category shall appear on the date notified by the Special Officer, before the Medical Board constituted by the Director of Medical Education, consisting of the Special Officer, three specialists, one each from the Department of Orthopedics,

Ophthalmology and ENT. The Medical Board shall examine the candidate and certify regarding the percentage of disability. A nominee of the Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities in Karnataka shall be present in the CET Cell on the notified day of seat selection. The decision of the Medical Board shall be final, depending upon which the candidate's eligibility for the allotment of seat shall be determined by the Special Officer.

Explanation: For the purpose of this clause, persons with disability shall have the same meaning assigned to it, in the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Participation) Act 1995 (Central Act 1 of 1995).

(2) Candidates with Physical Disability, candidates under NCC quota and Sports quota, shall be allowed to select seats in the first instance for the courses referred to in sub-rule (3) of Rule 1.

(3) Selection of seats shall be held in respect of Medical and Dental courses in the first instance, where all the eligible candidates and also those who have already selected seats under sub-rule (2) whether reported to the college or not, shall be allowed as per their merit order to select seats in the respective courses. The seat held by a candidate shall automatically stand cancelled if such candidate selects a seat in Medical and Dental courses. The candidate, who selects the seat, shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1). The CET Cell shall issue the Admission Order and the candidate shall report before the Principal / Administrative Officer of the concerned institution.

(4) The Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses seat selection shall be held after the completion of seat selection under sub-rules (2) and (3) where all the eligible candidates and also those who have already selected seats under sub-rules (2) and (3) whether reported to the college or not shall be allowed as per their merit order, to select a seat in the Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses. The candidates who have selected seats under sub-rules (2) and (3) if satisfied with the seat need not attend Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy round. If the candidate who has selected a seat under sub-rules (2) and (3) and selects an Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy seat, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled. The candidate, who selects an Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy seat, shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1). The CET Cell shall issue the Admission Order and the candidate shall report before the Principal / Administrative Officer of the concerned institution.

(5) The Engineering/Technology seat selection shall be held after completion of the seat selection under sub-rules (2) to (4), where all the eligible candidates and also those who have already selected seats under sub-rules (2) to (4) whether reported to the college or not, shall be allowed as per their merit order, to select a seat in engineering courses. The candidates who have selected seats under sub-rules (2) to (4), if satisfied with the seat, need not attend the Engineering, Technology seat selection round. If the candidate who has selected a seat under sub-rules (2) to (4) and selects an Engineering, Technology seat, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled. The candidate who selects an Engineering, Technology seat shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1). The CET Cell shall issue the Admission Order and the candidate shall report before the Principal / Administrative Officer of the concerned institution.

(6) The Architecture seat selection shall be held after completion of the seat selection under sub-rules (2) to (5), where all the eligible candidates and also those who have already selected seats under sub-rules (2) to (5) whether reported to the college or not, shall be allowed as per their merit order, to select a seat in Architecture course. The candidates who have selected a seat under sub-rules (2) to (5), if satisfied with the seat, need not attend the Architecture seat selection round. If the candidate has selected a seat under sub-rules (2) to (5) and selects an Architecture seat, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled. The candidate who selects an Architecture seat shall produce the specified original documents

and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1). The CET Cell shall issue the Admission Order and the candidate shall report before the Principal / Administrative Officer of the concerned institution.

(7) After completion of the seat selection round under sub-rules (2) to (6), the seats that remain unfilled, surrendered, cancelled, forfeited and newly added seats shall be treated as CASUAL VACANCIES. In the first instance, such reserved seats that remain under Rural and Kannada medium categories under reserved categories or under General Merit, as the case may be, shall be transferred to the respective general categories. Casual Vacancy seat selection will be held for reserved categories like Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Category - I, IIA, IIB, IIIA & IIIB in the first instance. The seats that remain unfilled thereafter shall be transferred to GM category and shall be offered to all the eligible candidates including reserved category candidates. The consequential vacancies arising in any category shall be retained in the same category and shall be offered to candidates belonging to the respective category only.

(8) Casual Vacancy seat selection shall be held first for Medical and Dental courses which shall be followed by Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses and then Engineering and Technology courses and then Architecture course.

(9) Candidates who have selected Medical or Dental or Indian Systems of Medicine or Homoeopathy or Engineering or Technology or Architecture seat and also candidates who have not selected any seat are eligible to participate in the casual vacancy round.

Provided that the candidates who have selected Medical or Dental or Indian Systems of Medicine or Homoeopathy seats in the admission round and who wants to opt for an Engineering or Technology or Architecture seat in the casual vacancy round, should invariably surrender the Medical or Dental or Indian Systems of Medicine or Homoeopathy seat either before the commencement or before the turn of such candidate during the casual vacancy round for Medical, Dental, Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses. This proviso is applicable to Engineering / Technology / Architecture seats also.

(10) Seat already selected shall automatically stand cancelled when such candidate selects a casual vacancy seat in Medical and Dental courses. The candidate who selects the Medical or Dental seat for the first time, shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1).

(11) The casual vacancy round for Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses shall be held after completion of the casual vacancy round under sub-rule (10). The candidate who selects Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy seats shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1).

(12) The casual vacancy round for Engineering, Technology courses shall be held after completion of the casual vacancy round under sub-rule (11). The candidate selecting such seats shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1).

(13) The casual vacancy round for allotment for Architecture seat shall be held after completion of the casual vacancy round under sub-rule (12). The candidates selecting such seats shall produce the specified original documents and deposit the specified admission fee in accordance with clause (iv) of sub-rule (1).

(14) A candidate who selects a seat in any discipline, course during casual vacancy round shall not be eligible to participate in further casual vacancy seat selection round.

(15) The seats that remains unfilled after the completion of the casual vacancy round under sub-rule (9) to (13) may be transferred to the respective colleges by the concerned Director, after reconciliation meeting.

(10) The Government may by order cancel any seat selection made under these Rules, for the reasons specified therein.

11. Execution of Bond by candidates selecting Medical seats (MBBS) in Government colleges - A candidate who selects MBBS seat in any of the Medical colleges run by the Government of Karnataka is required to execute a bond (signed by the candidate and parent) giving an undertaking that he is prepared to serve in any Primary Health Centre or Primary Health Unit in rural areas of Karnataka on completion of the course for a minimum period of one year and that in default thereof, the candidate will be liable to pay a penalty of Rupees One lakh to Government.

12. Forfeiture and Refund of fee - (1) If a candidate who has selected a seat under sub-rules (2) to (8) of rule 10, surrenders or cancels such seat, before the turn of such candidate in the Casual Vacancy Round, the Special Officer shall forfeit 20% of the fee paid.

(2) If a candidate who has selected a seat under sub-rules (2) to (8) of Rule 10, surrenders, cancels seat after the turn of such candidate in the Casual Vacancy Round is over, the Special Officer shall forfeit the entire fee paid.

(3) If a candidate selecting a seat in casual vacancy round under sub-rules (9) to (13) of rule 10, surrenders, cancels the seat, the Special Officer shall forfeit the entire fee.

(4) No surrender or cancellation of seat shall be accepted, unless the candidate surrenders the original admission order issued by the CET Cell and the original Bank Challan.

13. Penalties - (1) Where a candidate, parent, guardian furnishes any incorrect information in the application form for Common Entrance Test or produces any documents, records such as incorrect marks cards, statement of marks, certificates, affidavit etc., or commits fraud of any kind or obtains allotment by making incorrect statement or commits forgery or impersonation or indulges in any malpractice or makes any statement which is not true, at the time of entrance test or the seat selection and obtains the admission ticket, any record, admission order or where candidate commits malpractice of any kind in the qualifying examination, Common Entrance Test conducted by CET Cell or is a beneficiary of any malpractice detected or noticed during the Common Entrance Test or the Seat Selection or subsequent to the issue of the Admission Order, the seat allotted to the candidate, if any, shall be liable to be forfeited along with the fees paid at any time during the period of candidate's study. The candidate may also be debarred from appearing for the Entrance Test for such period as deemed fit.

(2) The candidate and his parent or guardian, as the case may be, shall also be liable for both civil and criminal action. The original documents submitted by the candidate may also be impounded.

(3) Where the Special Officer considers that the action should be taken under sub-rules (1) and (2), he shall pass orders in that regard after holding such enquiry as deems fit and after giving a reasonable opportunity to the candidate or parent or guardian to make representations, if any.

14. Appeal - Any person aggrieved by the order or decision of the Special Officer under these Rules may within 15 days from the date of such order or decision, appeal to the Principal Secretary, Secretary to Government (Higher Education) Education Department, Government of Karnataka, who after calling for records from the Special Officer and after examining the same, shall pass orders as he deems fit, which shall be final.

15. General - (1) A candidate is deemed to have been admitted to a professional college once the candidate has been allotted a seat by the CET Cell and the prescribed fee is paid at the admission center of the CET Cell. The Principal of the college shall immediately allow such candidate to join the course of study. In the event of refusal by the institution to allow the candidate admitted at the admission centre by the CET Cell to join the course, the aggrieved candidate may approach the jurisdictional Deputy Commissioner. The Deputy

Commissioner is authorised to enforce the compliance of the admission order issued by the CET Cell.

(2) In case of refusal by the institution to allow the candidate to join the course with the admission order issued by the Special Officer, the concerned University to which the college is affiliated shall enforce the admission order issued under these Rules, failing which, the concerned University shall take such action as it deems fit against the institution concerned by exercising the powers vested in it under Karnataka State Universities Act, 2000. (Karnataka Act 29 of 2001), Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Act 1994 (Karnataka Act 44 of 1994) and the Vishveshwaraiah University of Technical Education Act, 1994 (Karnataka Act 39 of 1994), as the case may be.

(3) All admissions made to and by the colleges shall be subject to approval by the concerned University.

(4) Any refusal by the concerned University to approve the admission after such verification as deemed fit regarding the eligibility or otherwise of the candidate to the course, shall not be the responsibility of the Special Officer or the Government and no claims shall be against the Special Officer or the Government.

(5) The candidate who has obtained a seat in any discipline through the CET Cell in any of the previous years shall not be eligible to continue in the course to which he has been admitted during the previous years immediately upon selection of a seat in a different discipline during the current year.

16. Publication of seat matrix and admission schedule - (1) The Government shall notify the provisional seat matrix of the professional institutions indicating the status of the institution, whether it is Government / private aided / private unaided / minority / non-minority etc., and call for objections, if any.

(2) Any professional educational institution or person aggrieved by the provisional seat matrix may file objections within seven days from the date of notification of the provisional seat matrix and the Government shall, after considering the objections, if any, notify the final seat matrix which shall be issued before the commencement of the Seat Selection by the CET Cell.

(3) Any increase in the intake or introduction of new course in any existing institution or recognition of a new institution after the commencement of the Seat Selection for the relevant year shall be taken into account for the purpose of allotment of seats under these Rules and any such increase shall be effective from the same academic year, provided the consequential seat matrix is issued by the Government before the commencement of the date notified for casual vacancy seat selection.

(4) If any Medical and Dental seat becomes available under All India Quota as communicated by the Directorate of Medical Services (Medical Education Cell), Government of India, the State Government shall issue seat matrix in respect of those seats and such seats shall be offered to the candidates during the casual vacancy round.

Provided that the seats made available under such quota shall not be offered for allotment, if they are communicated after the commencement of the casual vacancy round.

(5) The seat selection shall be held and completed by the Special Officers as per the calendar to be notified. In case of modification of the calendar the same shall be notified in at least two news papers published in the State of Karnataka and one news paper having all India publication and also put on the Website. No individual intimation shall be sent to the candidates in this regard.

(6) From the date of commencement of seat selection and till the completion thereof, the Special Officer shall cause daily publication of the availability of college-wise, course-wise and category-wise seats, by issue of daily bulletin and shall also put the same on the Websites.

17. Allocation of seats and procedure for admission to Second Year, Third Semester Engineering and Technology Courses - (1) Ten percent of the sanctioned intake of the first year of Bachelor of Engineering or Bachelor of Technology as reckoned from the sanctioned intake of the previous year shall be allocated for candidates possessing Diploma in the relevant branches of Engineering specified at column (2) of Schedule-I for admissions to Second Year, Third Semester Bachelor of Engineering, Bachelor of Technology courses specified in column (3) thereof. Such seats shall be Government seats.

Provided that in respect of Siddaganga Institute of Technology Engineering day college, existing intake for the first year Bachelor of Engineering shall be treated as the intake of Second year, Third Semester Bachelor of Engineering, Bachelor of Technology courses.

Provided further that in respect of Evening engineering colleges, the intake of first year Bachelor of Engineering is treated as the intake of third semester of Second year Bachelor of Engineering, Bachelor of Technology Courses.

(2) The conditions specified in Rules 5 and reservation specified in clauses (A), (D), (E) and (G) of sub-rule (1) and sub-rules (2), (3) and (4) of rule 8, as are applicable under these rules shall apply mutatis-mutandis to full time and part time diploma seats except clause (A) which shall not be applicable to part time diploma seats.

(3) The Special Officer shall publish on the notice board, CET-website and in the office of the Director of Technical Education and such other offices as he may deem fit and also by giving wide publicity in at least two news papers one in Kannada and one in English having circulation in the state calling for duly filled applications for Entrance Test and admission to full-time and part-time Engineering, Technology degree courses by specifying the last date for receipt of application. The details of the applications received shall be stored at the CET Cell. The Director of Technical Education shall conduct an Entrance Test (in the case of candidates for Architecture course there will be an aptitude test) under this rule for Engineering/Technology courses, with the assistance of Special Officer, CET Cell and shall cause preparation of merit list as specified in rule 5 among Diploma holders in the order of merit as specified under rule 4, which shall be the basis for allotment of seats to first year of Bachelor of Architecture or to Third Semester, Second Year of Bachelor of Engineering or Bachelor of Technology, full time and part time courses. The seats under diploma quota shall then be allotted as per the seat matrix issued by the Director of Technical Education in Karnataka in accordance with these Rules.

(4) For admission to part-time Engineering, Technology courses, out of the total seats, there shall be two categories, namely (i) 30 percent of the seats to the candidates possessing professional experience of SIX years and above; and (ii) 70 percent of seats to the candidates possessing professional experience of ONE year and above but less than SIX years.

Provided that if candidates with Professional Experience of SIX years and above are not available in the reserved class, such seats shall be filled by the respective reserved class candidates with professional experience of less than six years but more than one year.

18. Repeal and Savings - (1) Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admissions to Professional Institutions Rules, 2005 is hereby repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding such repeal anything done or any action taken under the repealed Rules shall be deemed to have been done or taken under these Rules.
