Dear Shri Hardeep Singh Puri ji,

At the outset, I take this opportunity to personally thank you for honouring us with your gracious presence on the occasion of the Inauguration of the extended stretch of the Namma Metro Purple Line. Must mention, your personal attendance and kind words have been extremely encouraging to the State government in general and the concerned parastatal in particular. Government of India has always extended its unwavering guidance and support to the State of Karnataka through its various initiatives, and it is hoped that the sincere appreciation the people of Karnataka have for the said initiatives is easily perceivable in return.

Further, with regards to certain schemes of the Union Government, the following few points are brought to your attention and seek your further help wherever required.

**A. Smart Cities Mission**

(a) Karnataka presently has 7 cities chosen under SCM (2 in phase 1, 4 in phase 2 and 1 in phase 3) and the implementation of the same is satisfactory. In this regard, my colleague, Minister for Urban Development, Government of Karnataka had written to you to consider 4 more cities, Kalaburagi, Mysuru, Vijayapura and Ballari. I am given to understand that it was informed that inclusion of those cities may not be possible in 2020 since the 100 cities were already chosen. Hence it is requested that the proposal may be relooked into for the coming batch of Smart Cities.

(b) Also I am given to understand that the timely release of grants for SCM by both the Central and State governments has led to a fortunate situation that substantial interest on the said grants has accrued. The respective SCM cities have already prepared the Action Plan of works the civil society is expecting us to implement, which now can be taken up under this additional amount. In this regard I take this opportunity to request you to allow usage of such interest accrued for taking up additional works in the same city adhering to SCM guidelines.

**B. 15th FC Grants**

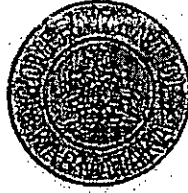
**(a) Million Plus Cities:**

Goi has released Rs 279 Cr for Air Quality Improvement and Rs. 279.00 Cr for SWM & Water Supply etc works for the year 2020-21.

Here, we take this opportunity to bring to your attention that release of remaining amount of Rs. 421 Cr for 2021-22 is still awaited from the Government of India, and quick release of the same will ensure that the progress of the projects is not hampered in anyway.

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
(b) Non-Million Plus cities:

Kindly refer to D.O. letter No.CM/265/GoI/2021 of 6 September 2021 regarding inclusion of some more cities of Karnataka under next batch of Smart Cities Mission and consideration of release of grants under 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission.

Smart Cities have been selected through a two-stage competition. Smart Cities challenge has been completed with the selection of Shillong as the 100th City. At this stage, it is not feasible to add any new city as a Smart city under the mission. Presently, there is no proposal under consideration for the next batch of Smart Cities by the Government of India.

Further, Smart Cities Mission (SCM) is aimed at creating replicable models in the 100 Smart Cities which can act as 'lighthouses' for other aspiring cities of the country. In order to support States/UTs and cities in their journey towards Smart Cities, a workbook titled 'Making a City Smart: Lessons from the Smart Cities Mission' has been released by this Ministry recently. The workbook encapsulates learnings from on-ground implementation of SCM over the past five years, and can be used by State Governments to handhold all their cities through the What, Why and How to make a city 'Smart'. The workbook is available online at: <https://smartnet.niua.org/content>.


As far as usage of interest of earnings of deposits of Government fund is concerned, all cities are required to adhere to the provisions of Rules 230(8) of General Financial Rules, 2017.

Regarding 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission (FC) Grants in respect of Million Plus Cities (MPCs), it is mentioned that Rs. 281 crore has been allocated for components of Solid Waste Management, sanitation & water supply for the year 2021-22 for the State of Karnataka. Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is nodal Ministry for these components of grant. As per operational guidelines issued by Department of Expenditure, grants under 15<sup>th</sup> FC for Million Plus Cities for 2021-22 onwards will be released in a single installment. In order to assist the States/ MPCs for submitting the required information for claiming the 15<sup>th</sup> FC grants, my Ministry has developed City

Finance Portal ([www.cityfinance.in](http://www.cityfinance.in)). Handholding Workshop was organized with the State of Karnataka on 26 August, 2021 through video conference on procedure for claiming the grant for Million-Plus and Non-Million Plus cities. Once claims for the grants are submitted by the State, my Ministry will examine and send its recommendation to Department of Expenditure.

Further in respect of Non-Million-Plus Cities, it is mentioned that First installment of Tied and Untied grants allocated to Non-Million Plus Cities amounting to Rs.375 crore has been released to the State. Second installment will be recommended for release to Department of Expenditure after submission of claim by the State on City Finance Portal as per operational guidelines issued by Department of Expenditure.
