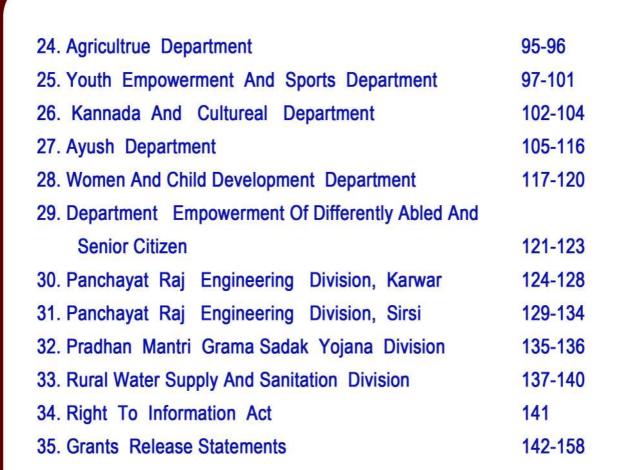

RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES 2018-19

1) Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme: (M.G.N.R.E.G.S)

Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme MGNREGA is being implemented in Phase 3 since 01-04-2008 in Uttara Kannadadistrict. The main objective of this scheme is to enhance livelihood security in rural areas by providing at least 100 days of guaranteed wage employment in a financial year to every household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work and thereby creating durable assets. Under this scheme, water conservation and rain water harvesting, drought proofing, individual work, Irrigation facilities are provided. Revival of water sources, land development, flood control and protection, rural connectivity, agriculture related activities, cattle shed, fish pond, farm pond, Bharata Nirman Rajeev Gandhi Seva Kendra works can be taken up.

Under this scheme, out of total released grant, 90 percent is central share and 10 percent is state share.

In the year 2018-19 out of Rs. 46.69 cr released and Rs. 46.69 cr expenditure hasbeen booked. Total 160667 households are registered and job cards has been distributed to 159692 households under this scheme. 15.05 Lakh person days has been generated and 5900 works has been completed and 16803 works are ongoing.

2) Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (G) Scheme:

Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana Scheme is Central Scheme Project. This scheme was introduced in financial year 2016-17 with the unit cost of Rs. 1,20,000/- subsidiary amount.

Selection of beneficiary done through Gram sabha based on socio economic caste census of 2011. Under PMAY scheme. Beneficiary can avail Bank loan of Rs. 30,000/- under D.I.R. Bank loan. Conveyance under MGNREGA for 90 Man days is covered under MGNREGA scheme.

Under the Socio-economic caste centsus 2011 financial year. All eligible beneficiaries selected under PMAY scheme. Beneficiary should be under below poverty line to avail housing facility under PMAY scheme. Strictly women beneficiary should be selected. Special preference is given to Widow, Ex-service man and handicap. Mode of payment done through GPS photo capture of four stage such that Foundation, lintel, roof and complete stage.

During the financial year 2017-18 target of 512 allotted to Uttara kannada district. 251 beneficiaries are been selected. 83 houses are been completed and 119 houses are under different stages. 261 beneficiaries selection is under process. Target is not fixed for the year 2018-19.

3) Basava Housing Scheme

During financial year 2017-18 total 12128 target was allotted to Uttara Kannada District. In course of selection of beneficiary 40% allotted for SC, 10% ST & General 50% out of 50%, 5% to handicapped 1% Ex-Service man and senior citizenship. Beneficiary should be under below poverty line and should hold income limit up to Rs. 32,000 annually and should be settled in gram panchayat area holding his own land for construction of house and should be selected under Gram Sabha.

Unit cost of Rs. 1,50,000.00 out of which Rs. 1,20,000.00 as subsidiary amount. Rs. 30,000.00 loan under (D.I.R) bank. Conveyance under MGNREGA for 90 Man days is covered under MGNREGA scheme.

Mode of payment done through GPS photo capture of 4 stages (Foundation, Lintel, Roof, Complete) amount released directly to beneficiary bank amount.

During the financial year 2017-18 target of 12128 allotted to Uttara kannada district. 11843 beneficiaries are selected. 1967 houses are been completed and 6170 houses are under different stages. 4620 Target has been fixed for the year 2018-19.

4) Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Nivas Housing Scheme

Under Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Nivas Housing Scheme only SC/ST beneficiary covered under this scheme. Beneficiaries are been selected under gram sabha.

70% SC, 30% ST allotted from government. Conveyance under MGNREGA for 90 Mandays is covered under MGNREGA scheme.

Beneficiary under Socio economic caste census (2011) are entitled for Dr. B. R. Ambedkar scheme. Beneficiaries should be under below poverty line, income should not exceed more than Rs.32000/-. Beneficiaries should be from Rural Area & He/She should have identification from same Gram that is Ration card, Voting Card. Beneficiaries should have Land owning in Rural area and Consist record by the name of Husband/Wife/Father or Grand Father. Beneficiaries should not take any Housing facilities from any other Govt. agency or from any Department.

Mode of payment done through GPS photo capture of 4 stages (Foundation, Lintel, Roof, Complete) amount released directly to beneficiary bank amount.

During the financial year 2017-18 target of 2310 allotted to Uttara Kannada district. 887 beneficiaries are been selected under SC category and 318 beneficiaries are been selected under ST category. 178 houses are been completed and 674 houses are under different stages. Target is not fixed for the year 2018-19.

5) Gram Vikas Yojana:

The State government has announced the Gram Vikas Yojana in the year 2014-15. Under Gram vikas yojana three years overall development of five villages including the two villages in which Scheduled cast/ Scheduled Tribe population is in majority has taken under every VidhanSabha constituency.

On the basis of 2011 population, per village population is 1000 and per head village development grant is Rs. 7500/- so availability of grant to every village is Rs.

0.75 crores and also every voting area having maximum 5000 population and such five village maximum Rs. 3.75 crore has been distributed. Under the Gram Vikas Yojana sanction is given to gram panchayat for taking responsibility of implementing approved plans by the government.

In six assembly constituency of Uttara K annada district, 38 village have been selected and Rs. 2924.890 Lakh grant has been released by the government. This grant is released to the related gram panchayat as per target. (Rs. 1886.89 Lakh has been spent)

6) Chief Minister Gram Vikas Yojana:

The state government announced Chief Minister's Gram Vikas Yojana in the year 2017-18. Under the Chief Minister's Gram Vikas Yojana overall development of all villages including two village in which the people belonging Scheduled Cast/Scheduled Tribes live in majority has been taken for three years plan.

Under the Chief Minister's Gram Vikas Yojana the power to select the 35 villages of the district under six Vidhan Sabha constituency has been given to the honourable MLA's. The honourable MLA has selected 35 villages in the district. For the development of each village Rs. 1 crore grants have been fixed.

In the year 2018-19 Rs. 1142.44 Lakh has been released out of release Rs. 558.43 Lakhs has been spent.

7) Western Ghat Development Programme:

The Main objective of the scheme is implementing watershed, area development & beneficiary oriented schemes in Western Ghat Area & there by improving rural people economic condition. Scheme will be implemented in such a way that local environment & biodiversity will be taken care off.

Important components of Western Ghat scheme:

- 1) To save the biodiversity.
- 2) To carryout the study regarding wild life.
- 3) Improving, agriculture, forestry & Horticulture sector.
- 4) To develop medicinal plantation.
- 5) Educate people regarding biodiversity & environment conversation.
- 6) Developing entire watershed in Integrated manner.

All the above programmes is being implemented as per common guidelines for watershed development revised edition 2011 & developing forest, Horticulture, Veterinary, Sericulture & Non conventional energy sources & Soil conservation in integrated manner. During the year 2018-19 out of Rs.83.20 lakhs available grant including OB an amount Rs.35.06 lakhs spent & 42% progress achieved.

8) Biogas Development Programme:

In Rural areas National Biogas development programme is being implemented since 1982-1983. By using animal waste, the biogas is generated. The main objective of the programme is to mitigate the drudgery of the women by creating smokeless environment in kitchen & providing clean cooking fuel thereby conserving the forest & environment.

During the year 2018-19 against 350 physical target 100% progress achieved. By disbursing Rs. 30.475 lakhs central & Rs.16.38 lakhs State subsidy financial progress achieved.

9) Taluk Panchayat unrestricted Grant:

Rupees one crore grant provide yearly all Taluk Panchayat coming under Zilla Panchayat parameter is to be utilized in restricted for the following purpose as per Government order No: ಗ್ರಾ.ಅ.ಪ:127:ಜಿ.ಪಂಸ:2017, dated:15-07-2011 & dated: 06-02-2012.

- 1) For Social forestry, earth conservation in forest construction of ground nut.
- 2) Open bore well for drinking water.
- 3) Construction Toilets kitchen & water supply for schools & Anaganwadi's.

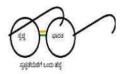

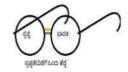

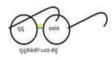
Incentive as provided under the Swachha Bharath Mission

- * The construction of Individual Household Latrines (IHHL) shall be available for all Below Poverty Line (BPL) Households and Above Poverty Line (APL) households restricted to SCs/STs, small and marginal farmers, landless labourers with homestead, physically handicapped and women headed households.
- * The Incentive amount provided under SBM(G) to Below Poverty Line (BPL) / identified APLs households shall be up to Rs.12,000 & SC/ST house hold shall be up to Rs. 15000 for construction of one unit of IHHL and provide for water availability and cleaning of the toilet.
- * The maximum support per-unit prescribed for a Community Sanitary Complex is Rs. 2 lakh. Sharing pattern amongst Central Government, State Government and the Community shall be in the ratio of 60:30:10.
- * As per the baseline survey conducted during 2012, Uttar Kannada district has 227878/- rural families out of which so far 2,27,878 individual house hold latrines have been constructed under this programme. Additional LOB target is 10,532 fixed in 2018-19 onwards.
- * SLWM is to be taken up in project mode for each Gram Panchayat (GP) with financial assistance capped for a GP on number of household basis to enable all GPs to implement sustainable SLWM projects. The total assistance under SBM(G) for SLWM projects shall be worked out on the basis of total number of households in each GP, subject to a maximum of Rs.7 lakh for a GP having up to 150 households, Rs.12 lakh up to 300 households, Rs.15 lakh up to 500 households and Rs.20 lakh for GPs having more than 500 households. Funding

for SLWM project under SBM(G) is provided by the Central and State Government in the ratio of 75:25.

- 1. Uttar Kannada district has been declared as an open-defecation free (ODF) district in 2017-18.
- 2. The entire cleanliness program was organized with the participation of the CLTS community in the district.
- 3. To create awareness on cleanliness for elementary /high school students, a competition was organized on Clean Village subject and open Dificate pre and waste disposal essay competition.

UTTARA KANNADA ZILLA PANCHAYAT, KARWAR FOR THE YEAR 2018-19

INTRODUCTION:

Uttara Kannada District comprises of 11 talukas out of which 5 talukas namely Karwar, Ankola, Kumta, Honnavar & Bhatkal stretching from Majali in the north to Gorte in the south covering a distance of 162 k. m.are in coastal region and the rest six namely Sirsi, Yellapur, Haliyal, Mundgod, Siddapur and Joida are inland talukas. The fishermen from both coastal as well as inland region are involved in fishery activity.

OBJECTIVE:

Providing supplementary facilities, technical guidance and economic assistance to the fishermen for fishery development of landing and berthing facilities for boats, registration of fishing boats, collection of warfage and other fees from fisheries harbor of the district, Development of inland fisheries, implementation of district, State and central sector scheme for fisheries development and implementation of welfare scheme such as fishermen group accident insurance claims and Sankast Parihar Nidi.

ORGANISATION STRUCTURE:

Assistant Director of Fisheries, Grade-1 Karwar, Assisant Director of Fisheries Grade-1(Craft and Tackle) Karwar are under administrative control of Uttara Kannada Zilla Panchayat and are implementing officer of fisheries department at district level. In every taluka except Joida and Siddapur, there are Assistant Director of Fisheries Grade-2, who along with the their subordinate staff are the Taluka level implementing officers. In addition there is the Sagara Matsyalaya which has become a tourist attraction in Karwar.

During the year out of a total of 100 resources available, 79 Departmental tanks, 03 river stretches and 1 reservoir have been disposed and developed by stocking 61.59 lakhs fish seeds.

Against a target of 12.00 hactares of Private Fish culture ponds to be developed by stocking 3.25 lakh seeds, 12.53 hactares has been developed by stocking 384000 fish seeds. During the current year there was very little rainfall, due to which most

of the tanks did not fill up. In spite of this there was a marked good progress in fish seed stocking.

Marine Fisheries:

Marine fish production: Against a target of 102500 metric tons, 122271.19 M.tons of fish production has been achieved during the year exceeding the target. Where as in the inland sector, due to the drought affected resourceful Haliyal and Mundgod talukas, though there was a target of 1000 tons of fish production target, 587.14 MT. fish production has been achieved.

State sector schemes:

1) Fishery requisite Kits:

Under this scheme a budget of Rs. 1.50 lakhs was released and the entire amount was spent by distributing fishery requisite kits (each kit worth Rs. 10000/- each) to 15 beneficiaries.

2) Distribution of fiberglass coracles:

16 beneficiaries have been supplied with fiberglass coracles by spending the allotted Rs.1.50 lakhs under this scheme.

3) Fish farmers day has been celebrated in two talukas by conducting workshops and field days where in 100 fish farmers were given information and training on improved fish farming methods.Rs.0.40 lakhs has been spent on this component.

4) Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojane(RKVY)

- (i) <u>Fishery requisite kits</u>: Rs.2.00 lakhs had been released to give assistance to 20 beneficiaries. Out of this 14 SCP, 6 TSP beneficiaries have been supplied fishery requisite kits, each kit worth being Rs.0.10 lakh, thereby spending the entire amount.
- (ii) <u>Distribution of fiberglass coracles:</u> Rs.2.00 lakhs had been released to give assistance to 20 beneficiaries. Out of this 14 SCP, 6 TSP beneficiaries have been supplied with fiberglass coracles, there by spending the entire amount.

5) Special component plan:

(i) <u>Fishery requisite kits and coracles</u>: Rs.1.00 lakhs had been released under this component has been spent by giving assistance to 5 SC fishermen beneficiaries by way of subsidy for purchase of fishing nets and fiberglass coracles.

6) Fishermen cooperative societies:

There are 43 primary fishermen cooperative societies and one district level fisheries federation in Uttara Kannada District. With the help of these institutions the department has been implementing schemes such as Diesel subsidy, Matsyashraya housing, centrally sponsored savings and relief scheme for fishermen etc for the overall development of fishermen. These institutions play an important role in fisheries development and also help the department in the process of selection of beneficiaries. The FCS who have their own land Rs.7.50 lakhs has been given for the construction of office building. The FCS Amdalli, Alvekodi and Belke are getting this benefit.

7) <u>Matsyashraya Housing Scheme</u>:

During the year 2018-19 any new target has been not announced by the Government. But department tride to complete the previous year target and god success in this regard by completing many of the uncompleted houses.

8) Fishermen distress relief scheme:

Under this scheme during the year 2018-19, 20 fishermen families have been given Rs.42.157 lakhs relief amount for loss incurred to nets, boats due to natural calamities as well as loss of life or disability/hospital expenses due to accidents while fishing.

9) Group accident insurance for fishermen:

Under this scheme during the year 2018-19, 14 fishermen applications sent to Directororate and wating for Rs.28 lakhs insurance amount for loss of life due to accidents while fishing.

- **10)** <u>Diesel subsidy</u>: About 800 mechanized fishing vessels operating in the district have been given back end subsidy of Rs.11.36 crore by way of direct transfer to their accounts for diesel purchased for fishing activity.
- 11) <u>Codend net distriction New Scheme</u>: For the sustaineable fisheries government announce free distribution of Codend Net of 35mm mesh size, to trawl boats which are registred in the department at the cost of Rs.10,000/- / unit during the year 2018-19. More than 300 units distributed each unit comprises of 3 nets.

Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services is managing various livestock related activities in the district of Uttara Kannada. Prominent among them are animal husbandry development, Fodder Development, Socio-economic programmes, Extension services, Training, Poultry development, rearing of rabbits and implementation of popular schemes and maintaining health of livestock resources of the district. Every season, sample surveys have been conducted to assess the quantum of livestock by-products production like Milk, Egg, Meat, and Wool. Based on the data available, assessment of gap between the production scenario and potential of production among the livestock resources is estimated and efforts are made to improve the production of livestock products.

***** Veterinary Institutions

The Veterinary district administration manages primary veterinary centres, veterinary dispensaries, Veterinary hospitals and polyclinic. By the end of 2017-2018 primary veterinary centres have been upgraded to dispensary status. It includes Basagod, kodlagadde (Ankola), Bhagwathi (Haliyal) Kharva (Honnavar) Kinnar (Karwar) Holagadde (Kumta) Korlakatta (Sirsi) Mavinamane (Yellapur) and Akhethi (Joida).

A district level disease diagnostic laboratory has been centred at Sirsi under Institute of Animal Health and Veterinary Biologicals. Besides, Taluk level disease diagnostic laboratories are functioning at Karwar, Bhatkal, Kumta, Siddapur and Sirsi. In order to prevent the spread of contagious / infectious disease, illegal transportation of fodder and animals at inter-state borders, check posts are functioning at Majali in Karwar and Anmod in Joida Taluka. The Mobile Veterinary Clinic at Sawanthwadi in Karwar is providing door step services to livestock farmers.

* Performance of Veterinary Institutions

Veterinary Institutions have been functioning with prime motto to treat the ailing animals. The staff monitors disease status in and around the official vicinity of respective institutions, inorder to prevent disease spread. Regular Vaccinations have been carried out at war footing to control the disease and thus prevent animal deaths. In this way, by protecting the animals, farmers livelihood is taken care as animal husbandry supports sustainable earning to the farmers.

Vaccinations have been provided from the department for Foot and Mouth disease, Black Quarters, Hemorrhagic septicemia, Brucella, PPR, Rabies and Enterotoxaemia. No of animals vaccinated during 2018-19 against above diseases were 807106. Ranikhet vaccine were done for 229197 birds.

1) <u>Fodder Development</u>

Quantum of 3583 hectares of land has been the target for the year 2018-19 for fodder development. Along with 21984 Fodder Mini-kits provided under various programmes, about 4060 hectares have been brought under improved fodder production by motivating the dairy farmers. During the year 2018-19, there was no fodder shortage in Uttara Kannada district.

2) Rabbit Rearing Centre

Department has initiated rabbit rearing for the interested farmers by opening rabbit farm at Shirsi. This is used as breeding and selling centre for those who are interested in rabbit propagation. At the initial part of the year 49 Males and 56 Females were reared. By the year end about 23 rabbits were sold to the interested farmers leaving the stock at 11 Male and 25 Females.

3) <u>Infertility Camps</u>

Inorder to improve the fertility status of dairy animals for having better progeny and production status, the infertility camps have been conducted to maintain regular reproduction cycles. Under financial head 2403-00-101-0-64 about 30.92 lakhs were released for conducting 143 camps and during 2018-19 by utilizing 30.91 lakhs 146 infertility camps have been conducted successfully.

4) <u>District Special component plan and Tribal sub plan</u>

Department has undertaken the socio-economic programmes among which Special component plan (SCP) and Tribal sub plan (TSP) are important. District wise special component plan had an outlay of 5.909 lakhs covering 91 scheduled caste beneficiaries. Among them 89 beneficiaries have benefitted by expending an amount of 5.006 lakhs. Tribal sub plan had covered 1 scheduled tribe beneficiaries for which 0.60 lakhs had been released. The TSP has benefitted all the selected farmers with complete financial progress.

4) A) State sector Special Component Plan and Tribal Sub Plan:

The Dairy farmers under state sector special component plan had an outlay of 115.23 lakhs covering 239 scheduled caste beneficiaries. Under this, the economic progress has been achieved by utilizing 115.23 lakhs to 239 beneficiaries. Similarly under state sector Tribal Sub Plan 44.34 lakhs had been released for 86 scheduled tribe beneficiaries. This has been successfully implemented by completely utilizing the funds released.

5) Medicines, Minerals Vitamins and Equipment distribution

Regular treatment of animals being prime motto of the department, an amount of Rs 225.00 lakhs had been released under the head of account 2403-00-101-0-27 for medicine and chemical purchase. Under this , amount of Rs. 15.00 lakhs about 37905 litres of liquid Nitrogen has been purchased for maintaining the semen under frozen condition for carrying out regular Artificial Insemination in 144 institutes of the district. For daily routine treatments , medicines have been purchased following the rules and regulations of medicine, equipments purchase for an amount of 209.96 lakhs. These medicines have been distributed to all the 144 institutions respectively.

6) **Building Repair**

An amount of 70.00 lakhs had been released under the head of account 2403-00-101-0-28 for building repair works. This has been covered from Zilla Panchayath building repair work programme. Among 70.00 lakhs released, 69.64 lakhs has been utilized for repair works of different veterinary institutions in the district. These include Ankola, Adigaon, Hillur, Bailur, Kuntwani, Bengre, Kudragi, Areangadi, Haldipur, Kharva, Kekkar, Mudkani, Balakur, Kumta, Santeguli, Hiregutti, Karwar, Kinner, Devalmakki, Sirsi, Korlakatta, Hulemalagi, Ajjibala, Hulekal, Hegdekatta, Devanalli, Isloor, Siddapura, Herur, Itagi, Lambapur, Shiralagi, Tergaon, Madanalli, Yadoga, Ambikanagar, Belavatagi, Mundgod, Kalkeri, Joida, Ulavi, Ramnagar, Kirvatti, Nandolli, and Manchikeri. The building repair works were entrusted to the Zilla Panchayath Engineering Division Sirsi and Karwar.

7) Rearing of Giriraja Birds

The distribution of Giriraja Birds under backyard rearing system is one of the popular programmes of the Deaprtment. Under the head of Account 2403-00-103-0-31 Rs 10.00 Lakhs had been released. An amount of 9.99 lakh has been utilized for successful implementation of the programme in all the talukas. The programme aims at using the funds for rearing birds upto 6-7 week, towards feed and vaccination. About 11489 birds were distributed to Women beneficiaries covering OBC/SC /ST. The OBC women were provided with the birds at 75% subsidy and SC / ST women on 100 % subsidy basis. All the beneficiaries were provided with 10 birds each.

8) <u>Strengthening the Extension Units/activities:</u>

Under the head of account 2403-00-101-0-30, an amount of 30.00 lakhs were released. The extension works were carried out under Kisan Samparka Sabha, Cattle Rallies, Livestock Show, Milk Competition, Cattle Festival, Technical / NonTechnical Staff Training and other Extension activities. Total of 29.93 lakhs have been utilized under this programme.

- 9) Karnataka Sheep and Wool Development Board under RKVY has supported the propagation of 10+1 sheep / Goat rearing units by providing 10 beneficiaries financial outlay of 6.00 lakhs. 8 Scheduled caste beneficiaries and 2 Scheduled Tribe beneficiaries have been benefitted by utilizing 6.00 lakhs.
- **10) Karnataka Sheep and Wool Development Board** for Mobile Meet Centre units an amount of 8.25 lakhs for One beneficiary were released. Among them one Scheduled Caste beneficiary have been provided with 8.25 lakhs and the progress has been achieved.
- 11) The Programme RKVY- AFDP aims at providing Fodder Minikits for improved fodder production to dairy animals. The minikits were provided three times during 2018-19 to different talukas based on the need and fodder availability in those areas the details have been presented as below.

Annual Report of the Department of Social Welfare Uttara Kannada for the year 2018-19

Department of Social Welfare is the nodal department to monitor the overall development of scheduled caste people in Uttara Kannada district. Especially providing financial assistance to the students of SC in terms of sanctioning various types of scholarships and incentives, management of pre metric and post metric hostels, residential schools etc. Special emphasis is given for infrastructure development in SC Colonies alongwith construction of various types of Bhavanas per social activities.

As per the 2011 senses, the total population of district is 1437169 out of which the population of SC is 116431. which is about 7.93.

The department in the district functions under the overall control of the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Panchayat. The department is headed by the Deputy Director, Social Welfare at the district level and he is assisted by Asst. Directors of concerned taluks.

To enable the socially disadvantaged Scheduled caste people with appropriate Socio economic interventions, to provide quality education, income generating activities, capacity building, infrastructure development to realize their full potential in a socially equitable environment, the department is implementing the following programs:

1. Education Schemes:

The main objective of the educations schemes is to promote the education among SC and STs by creating improved educational opportunities and establishment of quality educations institutions through

- a. Maintenance of 35 pre and post metric hostels
- b. Maintenance of the residential schools
- c. Admission of SC students to 3 prestigious institutions
- d. Grant-in-aid to one private hostel
- e. Sanctioning of pre and post metric scholarships
- f. Fellowships to M.Phil and PHD students
- g. Prize money to the students who secure first class marks in PUC and above classes

2. Employment and training:

The main objective of the employment and training division is to promote economic empowerment of SCs and to make them economically self-depended through:

- a. Monitoring and implementation of reservation in admission in educational institutions
- b. Implementing self-employment training programs such as LMV training, Computer training etc
- c. Issue of stipends to LLB graduates
- d. Admission to GNM/Nursing institutions
- e. Issue of Caste validity certificates

3. Social empowerment schemes

The main objective of the social empowerment scheme is to prevented and eliminate discrimination and exploitation through:

- a. Monitoring the payment of compensation and rehabilitation to victims of atrocities under POAAct.
- b. Monitoring and providing additional grants to inter-caste married couples.
- c. Payment of incentives to the couples who married in mass marriages

4. SCSP and TSP

In pursuance of Article 46 of the Constitution of India and for effective implementation of the guidelines issued by the planning commission of India in formulation annual plan the Govt. of Karnataka has enacted the Karnataka SCSP and TSP (Planning, allocation and utilization of financial resources) Act -2013 to provide earmarking a portion of state plan outline for the SCSP and TSP. Under the Act, the Department of Social Welfare is the nodal department for the overall supervision and control of SCSP and TSP grants implemented across various departments of the Government. In the district level there is in District Monitoring Committee which shall be headed by the Deputy Commissioner of District to review the implementation of SCSP and TSP periodically.

Thus, the department of Social Welfare with a vision to minimize and eventually eliminate disparity between the people belonging to socially disadvantaged scheduled castes/scheduled tribes and general category and there by enable by SC/ST people to lead a productive and dignified life through various approaches.

Backward Classes Welfare Department

Several measures already have been taken by the Government of Karnataka for the educational and economic advancement of the Backward Classes under Article 15(4) and 16(4) of the Constitution of India. Backward Classes welfare Department takes care of the welfare of Backward Class people and Implements various schemes and programs. Funds are provided by ZillaPanchayat and Central and State Government. Though some of the schemes are funded either wholly or partially by the Central Government through the Special Central Assistance and Centrally sponsored Schemes under Special Component Plan, majority of the schemes are funded and implemented by ZillaPanchayat and State Government.

1) Mentainance of Pre-Metric and Post Metric Hostels:

In Uttara Kannada District 46-Pre-Metric Boys Hostels, 22-Pre-Metric Girls Hostels, 12-Post Metric Boys Hostels and 21-Post Metric Hostels were Mentaining by Backward Classes Welfare Department. Free food and accommodation facility provided to the students with free Books and Uniforms and Soap kit also provide (Pre-Metric students Only) and others facilities. In the year 2018-19, 7181-Students were admitted in hostels and Rs. 2343.00 Lakh Grants was Utilized.

2) <u>Fee Concessions Schemes:</u>

The Scheme 'Fee Concession' is implemented to benefit all the eligible students in post-matric courses. category –2A, 3A, 3B whose annual Income does not exceed Rs.1.00 lakh/-P. A irrespective of caste Cat-I of Backward Classes Rs.2.5 lakhs. This benefit is extended to the students studying in Government, aided and unaided institutions including evening colleges and open Universities. The students other than category –I are exempted for the payment of tution, lab (science subject) and examination fee only. The management of the Government aided /unaided institutions who do not collect the fee from the students eligible for fee concession are eligible for reimbursement of loss of fee income at the rates prescribed by the Government in similar Government institutions. In the year 2018-19 totally 24943 Students were eligible in this scheme and Rs. 990.55 Lakhs Sanctioned to concerne Institutions.

3) <u>Tailoring Training Centers:</u>

The Department of Backward Classes has introduced 2 Tailoring Training Centers through out the District to benefit poor and destitute women and widows belonging to Backward Classes. It is imparting training to these women in Tailoring, so as to enable them to earn their livelihood by way of self employment. The duration of the training is one year, during which every trainee will be paid a stipend of Rs.300/-pm. The department will supply the raw materials and other accessories required for the training. Examination will be conducted at the end of the training and each candidate who get through in this examination will be provided with a certificate and a Sewing Machine free of cost by the department. In the last year 40 candidates have been trained & the amount of 10.34 Lakh spent.

4) Payment Of Stipend To Law Graduates:

This scheme is being implemented with a view to impart four years training to fresh law graduates in-judiciary. The scheme is envisaged especially for the candidates belonging to category-I of Backward Classes. However the candidates belonging to other categories of Backward Classes will also be selected for the training, if sufficient applications from Cat-I candidates are not received/ the performance of the candidates belonging to Cat.-I is not satisfactory / if the conditions are not fulfilled. The candidates are selected for the training through the selection committee constituted under the chairmanship of the Chief Executive Secretery of Zilla Pachayatin every district. Totally 25 candidates are being selected for training every year throughout the state. These selected candidates are attached to the District Public Prosecutor/ Govt. Advocate /any Senior Advocate having a vast professional experience of not less than 20 years. Every trainee during the period of 4 years period of training are being paid stipend of Rs.4000/- Per Month, In the last year 25 candidates have been supported by giving Rs. 12.84 Lakhs under this scheme.

5) <u>Pre matric Scholarships:</u>

The objective of the Scheme is to provide financial assistance to the poor students belonging to backward communities to enable them to pursue primary and secondary education.

In the year 2018-19, Totally 81230 Students Rs. 682.73 Lakh Grants was Sanctioned.

6) Post Matric Scholarships:

The objective of the scheme is to award scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections / backward communities so as to provide them better opportunities for higher education, increase their rate of attainment in higher education and enhance their employment.

Post matric Scholarship is sanctioned to the B.C students studying in different post matric courses (i.e., after SSLC) in the recognized institutions and Universities of the State.

Anual Report of the Department of Tribal Welfare Uttar Kannada for the year 2018-19

Department of Tribal Welfare is the nodal department to monitor the overall development of scheduled tribal people in Uttara Kannada district. Especially providing financial assistance to the students of ST in terms of sanctioning various types of Scholarships and incentives, management of pre metric and post metric hostels, residential schools etc. Special emphasis is given for infrastructure development in ST Colonies alongwith construction of various types of Bhavanas for social activities.

As per the 2011 senses, the total population of district is 1437169 out of which the population ST is 34239 which is about 2.38% respectively.

The department in the district functions under the overall control of the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Panchayat. The department is headed by the District Tribal Welfare Officer at the district level and he is assisted by Asst. Directors, Taluka Social Welfare Officer of concerned taluks.

To enable the socially disadvantaged Scheduled Tribe people with appropriate Socio economic interventions, to provide quality eduction, income generating activities, capacity building infrastructure development to realize their full potential in a socially equitable environment, the department is implementing the following programs:

1) Education Schemes:

The main objective of the education Schemes is to promote the eduction among STs by creating improved educational opportunities and establishment of quality education institutions through

- a. Maintenance of pre and post metric hostels
- b. Maintenance of the residential Schools
- c. Admission of ST students to 3 prestigious institutions
- d. Sanctioning of pre and post metric scholarships
- e. Fellowships to M.Phil and PHD students
- f. Prize money to the students who secure first class in PUC, Degree and Post Graduation.

2) **Employment and training:**

The main objective of the employment and training division is to promote economic empowerment of STs and to make them economically self depended through:

- a. Monitoring and implementation of reservation in admission in educational institutions
- b. Implementing self employment training programs such as LMV training, Computer training etc.
- c. stipends to LLB graduates for Training Light Motor Vehicle.
- d. Admission to GNM/Nursing institutions
- e. Issue of caste validity certificates

3) <u>Social empowerment schemes:</u>

The main objective of the empowerment scheme is to prevented and eliminate discrimination and exploitation through:

- a. Monitoring the payment of compensation and rehabilitation to victims of atrocities under POA Act.
- b. Monitoring and providing additional grants to inter-caste married couples.
- c. Payment of incentives to the couples who are married in mass marriages.

4) SCSP and TSP:

In pursuance oa Article 46 of the Constitution of India and for effective implementation of the guidelines issued by the planning commission of India in formulation annual plan the Govt. of Karnataka has enacted the Karanataka SCSP and TSP (Planning, allocation and utilization of financial resources) Act-2013 to provide earmarking a portion of state plan outline for the SCSP and TSP, Under the Act, the Department of Social Welfare is the nodal department for the overfall supervision and control of SCSP and TSP grants implemented across various department of the Government. In the district level there is in District Monitoring Committee which shall

be headed by the Deputy Commissioner of District to review the implementation of SCSP and TSP periodically.

Thus, the department of Tribal Welfare with a vision to minimize and eventually eliminate dispartity between the people belonging to socially disadvantaged scheduled tribes and general category and there by enable by ST people to lead a productive and dignified life through various approaches.

5. <u>Implementation of Forest Rights Act:</u>

Department of Tribal Welfare is the Nodal Agency to implement to "The Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Right) Act, 2006 (No. 2 of 2007) and Rules 2008 (Amended Rules-2012) act.

A Brief Report of the Different Programmes of Minority Welfare Dept.

The Directorate of Minorities was carved out of Directorate of Backward classes and created in the year 1999-2000 to ensure a more focused approach towards issues relating to the notified minorities communities, namely muslim, Christians, jain, Buddhist, Sikhs and parsis. The directorate working with a vision to enable all the minority community people to lead a productive life with equal opportunities in the fields of socio, economic, education etc. the mandate of the directorate includes planning co-ordination, evaluation and implementation of development programmes for the benefit of the minority community.

The main functions of the department are to introduce schemes to promote accelerated socio-economic development of minorities, introduce educational concessions for students , implementation of schemes for development of women and children , providing training and employment opportunities, thereby tackling the problems of economic backwardness among the minorities. The directorate is the nodal agency for the implementation of schemes by the state and central government minority welfare department. The Directorate is located in Bangaluru.

Programmes scheduled by Govt. for minorities

1) Murarji Desai Residential School:

In the year 2005-06 the department started Murarji Desai Residential School in Haliyal taluka at Dandeli town in order to focus at the greater quality of education for both boys and girls. The school is started in the old administrative Office building of KPC at Ambewadi. Which has the capacity of 250 students. Since there is a lack of space In the existing building, to provide facilities to the students such as laboratory, sports ground, library and other essential facilities, D.C of Uttara Kannada sanctioned the land for the construction of the new Residential school building at Ambewadi. In Block no.19 an area of 3-0-0. The construction work of the Residential school building is under progress. The work first floor of girls residential school building civil work is already complited, only painting, electrication and furniture work under progress. The work of the ground floor of the boys residential school is under progress. Construction work of this building is entrested

to Karnataka Housing Board, karwar. In the year 2018-19 there were 167 students get admission in this school.

2) Minority Hostels:

In the year 2013-14 Department started Post Metric Boys Hostel at Sirsi . This hostel is opened in a rented building. All essetial facilities are provided to this Hostel. For Construction of own building for Hostel D.C of uttara kannada has Sanctioned land wide his order no. RB/L.N.D 147/16-17 d:24-04-2017 at chipgi village in sirsi taluka. The construction work is entrusted to district Nirmiti Kendra karwar. Administrative approval have been accorded for estimate by Directorate of Minorities Banglore For Rs.99.99 lakh out of Rs.100.00 lakh grant for the work. As per the proposal Rs.75.00 lakhs have been already released to the district Nirmiti karwar and the work of construction is started.

Apart from Sirsi, Govt. has sanctioned the post metric minority Hostels in karwar and Bhatkal taluka with the Capacity of 50 students. In the year 2016, as per the govt. proposal a hostel is already opened in karwar tq at bandishitta in rented building. For construction of hostel building D.C of Uttara Kannada sanctioned 15 gunta land at shejavad village behind sadananda palace govt. release Rs.114.28 lakhs for the construction of the building. Now at present the work is entrusted to district Nirmiti Kendra karwar. The estimated amount of the building that is Rs.99.99 lakhs has been already sanctioned to the District Nirmiti Kendra and the work is under progress.

In Bhatkal D.C sanctioned (0-9-12 Guntas) of land at Soosagadi village near Ananda Ashrama. The work of the construction of hostel is entrusted to (PWD) the estimation of the building is Rs.240.00 lakhs and Rs.57.14 lakhs are already released.

3) Private Hostels:

Minority Department provides food, expenditure to private minorities Hostels for all the students who are studing and reciding in the private Hostel look after by the minority agencies. Rs. 800 paid to each student per month depending on the attendance of the students. In mundgod Buddist have one and Christians have two private hostels. There are 205 students

who are getting the benefits in these hostels. So far department sanctioned Rs.14.58 lakh for the year 2018-19.

4) Shadi Mahal / Samudaya Bhavan:

To encourage and promote cultural activities and collective committee benefits, financial assistance as for the provision of Govt. sanctioned 2 crore at the District head quater and upto 1 crore at the other places will be sanctioned for construction of shadi mahal or samudaya bhavan to minorities communities. Though money is granted 50% of the estimated coast from the department and balance part should be paid by the trust itself.

In the year 2018-19 Govt. sanctioned Rs.38.95 lakhs to Ramanagar shadimahal and Rs.25.00 lakhs to Ulavi shadimahal building.

5) Repairs and Renovations of churches, construction of community halls, modernizations of madarasas:

To promote and develop Christian communities financial assistance is provided for the repairs and renovation of churchesconstruction of compound walls to cemetery and construction of samudaya bhavan of Christian community and modernization of madarasas of muslim community. The grant is sanctioned for these purpose as per the proposal submitted by the institutions.

In the year 2018-19 Govt. sanctioned Rs.201.80 lakhs for the renovation of 15 churches and Rs.37.50 lakhs for the construction of compound wall of 3 cemetery's. Govt. has also sanctioned Rs.7.20 lakhs for the orphanage at Mundgod. The grant has been sanctioned to the institutions under the guidance of D.C

In 2018-19 Govt. sanctioned the grant amount of Rs.40.00 lakhs to 4 madarasa institution each of there gets Rs.10.00 lakhs for the renovation, computer education and formal. The amount of Rs.5.00 lakh is already sanctioned to one of the 4 institutions.

6) Training forlaw graduates for minority:

A training for 4 years in legal professional is being provided to the law graduates. In the district 5 students are getting the benefits each year. The department is paying the stipend

Rs.5000 per month toeach candidates. They will be trained by well experience lawyers, who have minimum 20 years experience and 4 years practice.

7) Bidayi yojane:

The Bidayi scheme is being implemented to help out to the poor muslim, christians, buddist, sikh, jain and parsis women/divorces and widow an amount of Rs.50,000/- at the time of marriage for the purpose of purchasing essential commodities. The age limit of bride should be 18 years and above. Their annual income must be below Rs.1,50,000/- and should have BPL card. It includes both individual marriages as well as samuhika vivaha. In the year 2018-19, 212 muslims, 121 christians and 5 jain have been given benefits.

8) Information Centre:

In order to bring awareness among the minority community about the schemes and programmes undertaken by Govt. the minority information centers are opened in every talukas. They provide the necessary information time to time to the minority communities. Hence presently there are 11 taluka information centers opened in Uttara Kannada District.

9) CET Coaching for minority students:

From the year 2015-16 CET Coaching programe for Christian and other minorities has been started. This programme is for the students of P.U.C and above. There are 250 students out of which 50 Christians and 200 muslims students getting the benefits of this scheme in the year 2018-19

10) Vidhyasiri (Food and Accomodation) scheme:

Vidhyasiri scheme is for the minority students, studing in post metric / puc upto Phd level in govt. and Aided/ unaided institutions across the state who are not provided Hostel facilities. This scheme programme was started in the year 2015-16 for all the minority students who were studing after 10th standered. There are 105 students from Christian community, 281 from muslims and 15 from jainisam in the year 2018-19. They aregetting the amount based on their college attendance. This money is transfer directly to their bank accounts.

11) **Colony Development:**

The colonies, Mohallas and areas mainly dominated by the Minorities are not having

proper roads, Drainages, water supply, Drinking water facility and street lights etc. and to

help them by providing such basic required amenities, to create healthy atmosphere and

improve their life style.

In the year 2018-19 Uttara Kannada District received Rs.150.00lakhs under this scheme.

As per the action plan of The MLA's of related constituency. D.C has accorded approval to

action plan for 20 works in the district level committee. The works are entrusted to the panchayat

rajya Engineering Department.

Colonies Development 11 works of Bhatkal constituency have been entrested to KRIDL

. Total estimated cost Rs.300.00 lakhs. Out of this Rs.75.00 lakhs are already released by

Government.

HORTICULTURE DEPARTMENT

Introduction:

Uttar Kannada district is located in the lap of the Western Ghats of Karnataka State. It has less geographical area, but with natural forest resources and horticulture crops.

Among total geographical area of the district 62021.42 Hector (As per crop survey / reconciliation report of kharif season-2018-19) area is under cultivation of Horticultural crops. Area under different horticulture crops is as follows.

1.	Plantation Crops	47252.28 Ha
2.	Fruit Crops	9576.14 Ha
3.	Spice crops	5013 Ha
4.	Vegetable Crops	36 Ha
5.	Flower Crops	61 Ha
6.	Medicinal and Aromatic Crops	83 Ha

Plantation and spice crops are grownas are grown prominently in this district. Among these Coconut, Areca nut, Black Pepper, Cashewnut, Cocoa are important plantation and Betalvine, Nutmeg, Cinnamon, Turmeric, Ginger etc are important spice crops, Mango, Pineapple, Banana, Sapota are important fruit Crops, Patchouli, Khus, Wild Pepper, Citronella, Kokum, Sandalwood, Sweet Flag etc are important medicinal and aromatic crops. Sweet Potato, Leafy Vegetables, Pumpkin, Beans, Brinjal, Tomato, Onion and Radish are important vegetable crops of this district.

Administrative Classfication:

Deputy Director is the head of the district head quarter located at Sirsi. Uttara Kannada District has 11 taluks and Senior Assistant Director of Horticulture is head of taluk offices.

Horticulture Farms and Nurseries:

Hichkad Farm Ankola and Bachanike farm Mundgod are coming under the circumstance of Zilla Panchayat. In Kumta, Haliyal and Joida Taluks office nurseries are located where optimum quality grafts and seedlings are produced and marketed at departmental price to the Public.

I. Centrally Sponsored Schemes:

1. National Horticulture Mission:

In this scheme under Rs 409.44 Lakhs was released and 406.06689 Lakh rupees expenditure is done. In this scheme under balanced amount is Rs.3.37311 Lakhs

1. Pradhnana Mantri Krishi Sinchayi Yojana:

In this scheme 1392 farmers who implemented drip irrigation system get 90% subsidy. About Rs 332.60 Lakh rupees was released and Rs 327.93747 expenditure is done. In this scheme under balanced amount is Rs.4.66253 Lakhs.

2. Rashtriya Krishi Vikasa Yojane:

a. Public Private Partnership for Integrated Horticulture Development: In this scheme Rs 83.00 Lakh was released and Rs 81.32012 Lakh expenditure is done. In this scheme balanced amount is Rs. 1.67988 Lakhs

b.Precision farming in Horticulture :

In this scheme the released amount of Rs 2.00 Lakh is totally utilized. (Rs 2.00 Lakh expenditure.) About 3 beneficiaries took the advantage of this scheme.

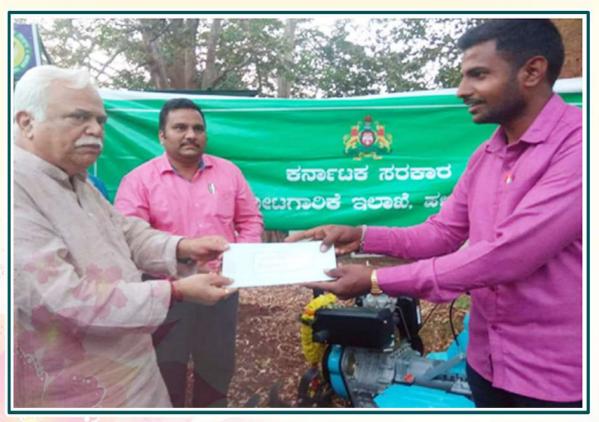

SERICULTURE DEPARTMENT

Uttara kannada district has got 11 talukas. Sericulture is introduced in all 11 talukas. For the development of sericulture Deputy Director office is working under Zilla panchayath. Following officers are coming under deputy director office: Assistant Director office at Siddapur-7 extension offices-5 ECRC- 5CRC-1 cocoon market-1 Grainage-1 and one sericulture farm. For the development of above office there are 1 ministerial staff and 10 technical demonstrators and inspectors are working.

In this district Sericulture department has got its own buildings including CRC and farm totally department has got 38 buildings. In this 4 CRC buildings has been given to Gram Panchayath and excess of farm buildings has given to Morarji Desai School at Haliyal. For extension work department has got two vehicle. In Uttara kannada sericulture is practicing in 408.15 acre of land with 330 farmers are taking sericulture. People of here are taking Sericulture as occupation in 175 villages. Out of 330 farmers, 21 farmers belongs to Schedule Caste and 4 Schedule Tribe and there are 46 women farmers and 13 belonging to minority group.

Uttara kannada district geographically divided into 3 parts. Lower Ghat, western Ghat and plain land. Here temperature and humidity is favor for sericulture. Here two variety of cocoons are producing. P1 for seed preparation and hybrid for reeling, Majority of cocoons are produced for seed purpose. In Uttara kannada district farmers producing good quality cocoons which goes for preparation of seeds, so this area is called as "Seed Area". Uttara kannada is famous for production of good quality cocoon in our state. The farmers marketing this quality cocoons at Tumkur, Bangalore, Rayapur, Shirahatti, Haveri and Ramanagar. In this markets farmers are fetching good rate for their cocoons. In our district farmers are following the department technical instruction and produces good quality cocoon and fetching good amount. There by improving below poverty line.

Achievement in new variety of Plantation:

During 2018-19 the target for plantation is 90 acres. Achievement is 92.25 acres of plantation. Percentage is 102.9 %.

These are the problems department faced during 2018-19. But now to overcome these entire problems department focused PMKSY drip irrigation and shade net supplied to the farmers at 75% subsidy to protect from wild animals.

Precautions taken for the implementation

- a) To overcome scarcity of water Tree Mulberry will be introduced at the farmers level.
- b) Shade net will be distributed to the farmers at the rate of 90% subsidy to avoid wild animals.

c) Already instructions given to all the taluka officers to produce nursery to avoid scarcity.

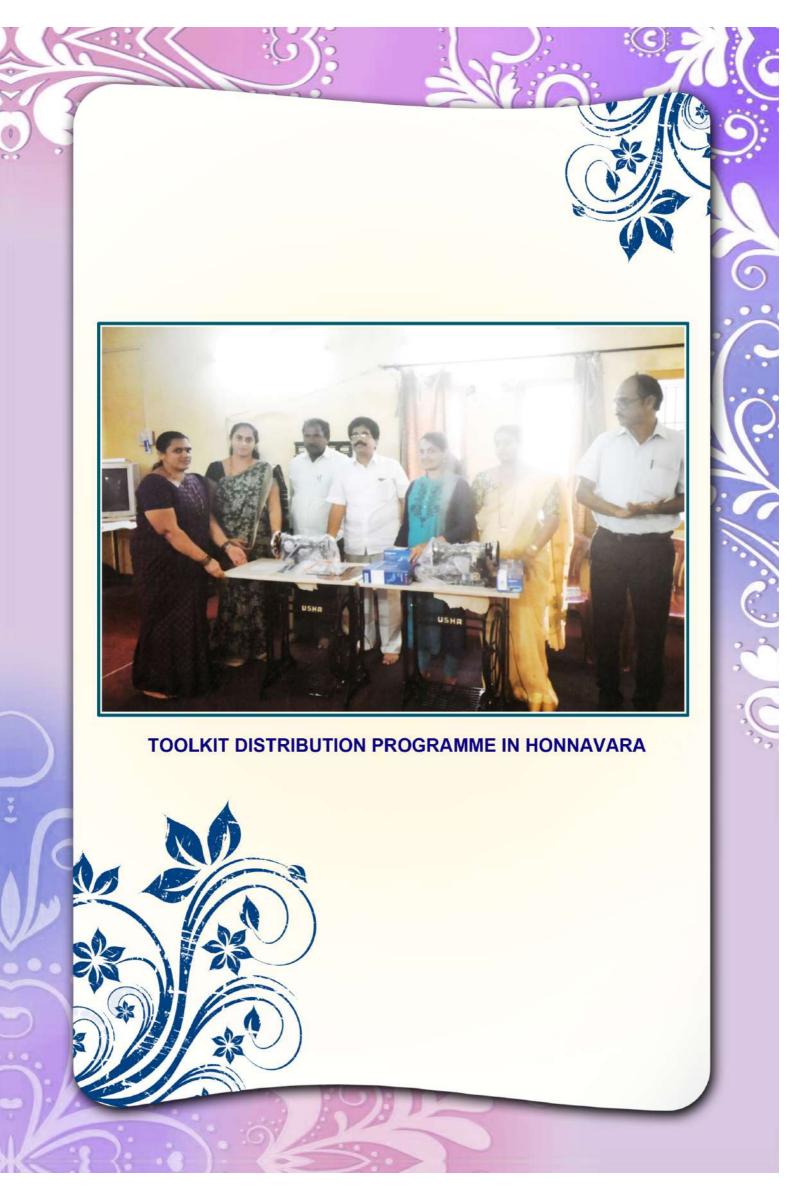

There is Goa state and Belgaum district in north side of Karwar district, in south side Udupi/D.K District, in west side Arabian sea and in east there is Dharwad/Shimoga are adjoining District place of uttarakannada district. The district comprises a total eleven talukas and 231 Gram Panchayats.

Social forest Division, Karwar is under the administration control of Zilla Panchayat Uttara Kannada Karwar. Basic Literacy Program

AIM:

Adult Education aims at conducting basic literacy program to the adults of the age group of 15+ belonging to the economically and socially deprived backward taluks having minimum literacy rate in the district and to help adult learner to satisfy their personal needs and achieve their professional goal and also to enhance their standard of living.

According to the guidelines of Director of Mass Education Banglore and Zilla Panchayat Uttarakannada. Karwar, in our District through District adult Education Office implemented various literacy programs in the District.

According to the reports of Dr. Nanjundappa backward taluks like Ankola, Bhatkal, Siddapur and Joida and those who below the 85% literacy rate like Honnavar, Yallapur, Mundgod, Haliyal were selected for this program through Link Document fund In the Year 2018-19.

Total illitraters were targeted and litreted through 394 learning centers during the 6 months stan of time. Beneficiers were taught basic literacy skills of Reading , Writing and Simple Calculation through 394 trained tutors.

For the development of the district and in order to increase the literacy rate and also eradicate illiteracy, with the co-operation of Zilla panchayat, taluk panchayat and Grampanchayat President, Members, Officers and volunteers literacy program have been implamented and inculcated teaching, learning atmosphere amoung the adults illiterates of the age group of 15+.

Evaluation is counducted by the District Institute Of Education And Traning (DIET), Kumata. Total 3726 Adult illitraters were succeded in basic skills of Reading, Writing and Simple Calculation.

MID DAY MEAL AND KSHEER BHAGYA SCHEME

With a view to enhancing enrollment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children, the National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (NP-NSPE) was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme

The Constitution of India in a Directive Principle contained in article 45, has made a provision

- (a) to provide for free and compulsory education to children in the age group of 6 to 14 years and for this purpose, a legislation would be introduced in Parliament after the Constitution (Ninety-third Amendment) Bill, 2001 is enacted;
- (b) which says that State shall endeavor to provide early childhood care and education to Children below the age of six years.

The task of providing education to all children in this age group gained momentum after the National Policy of Education (NPE) was announced in 1986. The Government of India, in partnership with the State Governments, has made strenuous efforts to fulfil this mandate by providing various schemes among which Mid-day Meal and Ksheerabhagya Schme is one among them.

And From 1/08/2013 State Government has introduced Ksheerabhagya scheme to 1 to 10th std students studying in Government and Aided Schools. From 17/07/2017 the scheme has been extended to 5days a week

The main objectives of the programme are:

- * To improve enrolment and attendance in schools.
- * To improve retention rate in classes.
- * To reduce the dropout rate annually
- * To improve health and hygiene of the child by increasing nutrition level.
- * To increase learning ability levels of children.

In Uttara Kannada district Mid day meal and Ksheerabhagya programme has been implemented in 2098 primary and 265 high schools totally 2363 School kitchen centers. Under this scheme 4342 cooks are working in School kitchen centers. And 157544 students are benificaries of this scheme.

AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT

Objectives:

There is need to improve the Income level of farmer families in the district through providing available departmental facilities at right time. Dissimination of Agriculture Extension activities in the form of Transfer of new technology, Quality agriculture inputs like seeds, plant protection chemicals, agriculture equipments etc to be provided to the famers on subsidy. Conducting trainings, demonstrations and study tours to convince farmers to adopt new technologies. Overall improve the yield levels of agriculture crops to enhance the production and to maintain food security.

1. Soil fertility card distribution under the Soil Health Mission

During 2017-18, Soil samples collected using GPS and tested 12 parameters like Soil pH, organic carbon,major nutrients, secondry nutrients like Sulphor, Potash and micronutrients like Zinc, Copper, Manganese, Iron and Boran,and results provided in the form of soil health cards. This method helping the farmer to avoid excess use of fertilizers by recommending balanced fertilizer application. Total 88996 soil health cards have been distributed to farmers in the district.

3. National Food Security Mission

The National Food Security Mission launched in the Eleventh Five Year Plan has been continued in the Twelth Five Year Plan period also. Major objective of this scheme is enhance the production of Rice and Pulse crops. The scheme is implemented in two sub schemes as NFSM(Rice) and NFSM (Pulses). In the district this year two types of specific technology demonstrations named as Direct Sown Rice(DSR) and Paddy Machine Transplanting have been implemented in the farmer fields.

4. Paramaparagat Krishi Vikas Yojane (PKVY)

This is Central sponsored scheme coming under National Mission on Sustainble Agriculture(NMSA) Mission and Soil Health Management (60:40 Ratio) 50 acres of 3 clusters are identified in every taluk to implement the scheme. Experienced Organic farming farmers are identified as Lead Resource Persons to for each cluster

to train the farmers of selected cluster. They are also prepare action plans of improved cultivation of local crops and necessary actions to be taken for Certification (PGS) of Local crops of porticul cluster. The major objective of this scheme is to support to grow important traditional crops and encourage local practices of identified areas.

4. Krishibhagya

The main objective of this scheme is rain water harvesting and utilizing water resources from natural resources to cultivate crops by construction of Farm ponds and improve the income level of farmers. This method will help the farmers to store rain water in constructed pond and avoid wastage of water. Under this scheme subsidy will be given in package method like to store the water construction of farm pond, Diesel pumpset for to lift water, Drip or Sprinklers for to irrigate crops, Poliythine lining, Shadenet for farm ponds etc. Total 80 % Subisidy for General category and 90% for SC/ST farmers for above said components. Krishibhagya scheme started this year only in the District. In the District farmer subsidy is distributed for Total 537 Farm ponds.

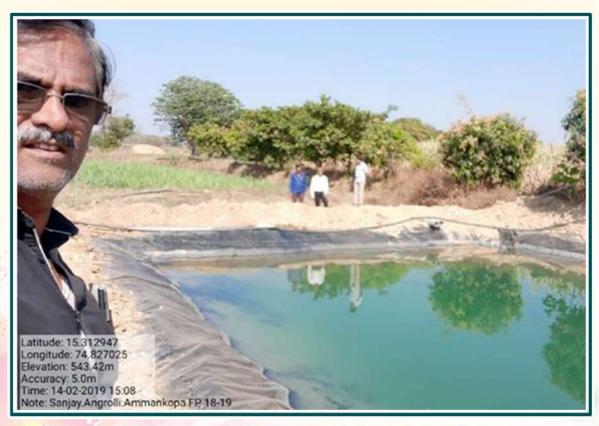
5. Zero Budget Natural Farming (ZBNF)

Zero Budget Natural Farming scheme is based on four important wheels: Bijamrita, Jivamruta, Mulching components Etc. Farmers practicing/interested in natural farming will be selected. CA, CRP are selected and a cluster is formed to carry out ZBNF practices. A committee is formed at cluster level by selecting farmers to implement the programme. Selected farmers are eligible for 90% subsidy or Maximum amount provision in the scheme whichever is less through DBT for implementing ZBNF practices. Individual activities like Mulching, Distribution of Seeds and seedling, cement pits, drums and raw materials for Bijamruta and Jivamruta preparation, biodigestor; community activities like establishment of seed Bank of local old varieties, Impliments hired from Custom Hired centres are covered under subsidy.

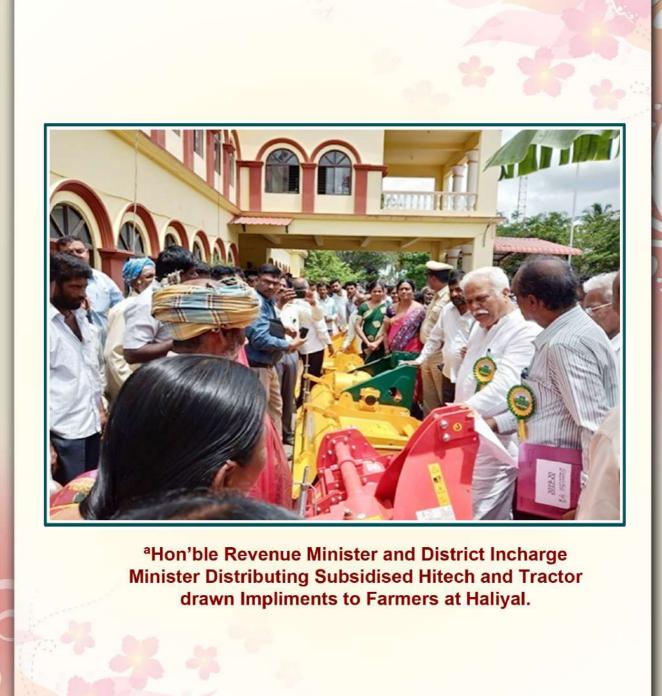

DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT-UTTAR KANNADA

INTEGRETED CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICE:

The implementation of the district sector schemes is entrusted to Zilla Panchayats through the Deputy Directors at the district level, who is assisted by an Assistant Director, a Programme Officer and ministerial staff for the proper and effective implementation of the schemes and programmes of the department. At the Taluk level, the Child Development Project Officer is in charge of implementation of the ICDS scheme and other programmes of the Department.

Department of Women & Child Development functions for the Welfare & Development of Women & Children in the society. Department aims at reducing the rate of Infant & Maternal Mortality; Improving Nutritional Status of the society & Reducing the rate of school dropouts & functions for the Improvement of Health Status of children below 6 years Pregnant, nursing mothers and also adolesent girls thereby also preventing Malnutrition. Department also undertakes various Programmes for the empowerment of women and protection of children.

Feeding Programme: Supplementary nutrition is given for 300 days in a year at a cost of Rs. 8.00 per beneficiary per day for normal children and for pregnant/nursing mothers under matrhrupurna program Rs. 21/- is spent for each beneficiary per day and for severely malnourished children Rs. 9.00 cost of nutrition per day. They will get 200ml milk and 5 eggs for 5 days in anganawadi centres. Besides that every child attending anganawadi centers are getting fortified iron 10 buiscits for 5 days supplied by Britannia Buiscits on free cost. During 2017-18 Rs. 2216.69 lakhs is spent for nutrition and 132977 beneficiarie got the benefit.

STHREE SHAKTHI YOJANE:

Sthree Shakthi Self Help Groups have been formed in the year 2000, to encourage and empower women to lead life independently. 15-20 women form groups and opened S.B.Accounts in Banks. This groups, involve them self in savings and lending within their group members for income generating activities they discuss various social issues, problems related to social and family life, involve themselves in socio-economic activities, and have emerged successfully with the assistance of Bank Loans. Uttar Kannada District consists of 2572 Sthree Shakthi Groups, constituting 37844 women members. Various economic activities like Jasmine cultivation, Fisheries, Dairy activity, Bakery Products, Begetable sale, Tailaring.

They involve in Pulse Polio Programme, Re admission of school dropouts, Actively partivipate in rural development programmes.

"KSHEERA BHAGYA" Yojane:

"KSHEERABHAGYA", -the innovative and prestigious program of distributing milk to school and Anganwadi children by the Karnataka Government was launched with the help of Milk Federation . It was introduced in Anganawadies Centers from 1st August 2013. Under the Programme "Ksheerabhagya". Under Ksheera Bhagya scheme 6 months – 6 yrs children are fed with 150 ml milk for 5 days in a week.

CONSTRUCTION OF ANGANWADI BUIDINGS:

2687 Anganawadi Centres functioning in Ulttara Kannada District. Out of it 1902 anganawadi Centres have their own buildings. During this year for construction of 52 anganawadi within Rs. 249.60 lakhs has been realised. Out of it 244.04 lakhs have been drawn. 11 buildings are under constructions. Remaining buildings yet to be started. Under M.G. Narega (Convergence) 40 buildings have been sanbctioned out of it 3 buildings are under constructions. During 2017-18 under MLA's fund 29 delapidated anganawadi buildings will be reconstructeof for that Rs.. 313.20 lakhs have been earmarke for this construction.

PROTECTION OF WOMEN FROM DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ACT:

As the name suggests, the Act provides protection to women in the form of Family Counselling, Legal Assistance or shelter as the case demands. Women in need may contact Child Development Project Officers of the particular Taluk who also perform the duties of Protection Officers under of PWDV Act and submit Domestic Information Reports of the Honourable Court.

SANTHWANA MAHILA SAHAYAVANI:

Women Helpline with free Phone No.1091, 11 Santwana Kendra's functions in all Taluks of Uttar Kannada to provide free protection, legal and medical assistance, shelter and counselling for woman in distress.

BHAGYALAKSHMI YOJANE:

This Scheme is started by the Government of Karnataka to improve the status of girl child in the family and society. Girl child born in BPL families subject to maximum of 2 children, receive monetary benefits when they complete the age of 18 years. For first child

Rs. 19,300/- and for the second child Rs. 18,350/- amount is deposited in the name of the girl child, in LIC of India, in the Form of Bonds. The girl child after attaining 18 years age, will receive the benefits, subject to conditions. Meanwhile. There is provision for Health Insurance, Family Insurance, etc. During 2017-18 year 2170 Bonds have been distributed to the beneficieries.

RAJIV GANDHI SCHEME FOR EMPOWERMENT OF ADOLESCENT GIRLS (RGSEAG) - SABLA

Adolescence is a significant period for mental, emotional and physiological development of children. A need has emerged to formulate a new comprehensive scheme with richer content merging the erstwhile two schemes – Kishori Shakthi Yojana (KSY) and Nutrition Programme for Adolescent Girls (NPAG). This scheme called Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls (RGSEAG)

Under this scheme, Supplementary Nutrition (SNP) and Non- Nutrition component services are provided to kishoris. GOI has directed to provide nutrition to 11-18 yrs out of school through ICDS network.

Adolescent girls are provided with services like training on life skills, Nutrition & Health Education (NHEd), knowledge about family planning, child care practices, home management, reproductive & sexual health, vocational skill training. They are provided with sanitary napkins/IRON and FOLIC tablets.

PREVENTION OF TRAFFICKING OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN:

Dept. has constituted District level, Taluk level and Gram Panchayat Level Committees with Official and Non official members to prevent illigal traficcking of women and children and also conducts regular Training Programmes and Awareness Camps to create awareness among the Publics. In every gram panchayat under the presidentship of gram panchayat president sub committee has been formed in this regard. The members of of these committees have been trained.

DESTITUTE COTTAGES:

The scheme is for taking care of orphan and destitute children. Financial assistance is given to registered voluntary organisations working in the field of child welfare recognize by the department with a unit comprising of 25 children. 90% of the unit cost as per schematic pattern is sanctioned by the zilla panchayat remaining 10%\$ from the organization. The NGO is eligible for maintenance grant @ Rs.1000/- p.m. per child (including the salary of the staff

approved in the scheme) and rent @ Rs.50/- p.m. per child. At present 03 cottages are functioning in the Uttara Kannada District. During 2017-18 75 childrens are benefited in these cottages

BALASNEHI SCHEME

Under this scheme attractive paintings of flowers, fruits, alphabates, animals, birds, vegetables, numbers etc will be painted in 220 anganwadi centres. Already in 172 anganawadi centres painting have been done. Remaining centres painting is going on. For this purpose Rs 50.00 lakhs have been sanctioned.

<u>DISTRICT MINISTERS CARE AND AFFECTION TOWARDS</u> <u>ANGANAWADI CHILDREN:</u>

Britania Biscuits company started supplying Fortified Iron Nutritious biscuits to all the 2687 Anganawadi Centres covering nearly 43000 beneficiaries Since April-2017. Childrens got 10 fortified iron biscuits for 5 days in a week. The percentage of Homoglobin in children is checked by the Doctors.

DISTRIBUTIONS OF TOYS TO ANGANAWADI CENTRES:

Toyota, Mysore paints and Varnish co. ltd. Aranya vasathi & Vihara Dhama Bangalore, have provided toys to 899 anganawadi centres in Karawar, Ankola, Kumta, Honnavar, Bhtakal, Siddapur, Yellapur, Haliyal, Joida, Talukas.

CHIKKI PRODUCTION FROM WOMEN IN DISTRESS:

With the Financial Assistance from women development corporation Bangalore and Assistence from N.R.L.M. scheme from Z.P. We have formed Two groups of women in difficult circumstance at Ankola, Sirsi and Karwar. They started producing Chikkis and sold it to M.S.P.T.C. Karwar, Sirsi, Honnavar and Kumta. This Chikkis are distributed to the children, pregnant and Nursing Mothers in anganwadi centres every working days. These women working in this unit are trying to come out from povery and mental agony they suffered and thereby developed self confidence with themselves. Departement Secretary Smt. Uma Mahadevan IAS visited the unit in Karwar and appreciated the intitiative. Taken by the Deputy Commissioner and Zilla Panchayat CEO.

Under Centrally sponsored Pradhan Mantri Grama Sadak Yojana (60% Central + 40% State fund) The village roads of the state are developed as per the PMGSY norms, by the Karnataka Rural Road Development Agency (KRRDA) and from 2010-11, under State funded Namma Grama Namma Raste Yojane (NGNRY) village roads selected by Elected representatives (MLAs) are developed as All weather roads as per PMGSY norms only. The development of these village roads not only helps villagers for communication, but also helps farmers to carry their Agricultural goods to near by market place, there by improving their financial status. Also Roads developed under both these schemes are maintained by the same contractors, (who have been entrusted these road development works) for 5 years after completion and then they are handed over to Panchayat Raj Engineering Department the parent Dept of these roads.

Under this KRRDA, A Division office with Executive Engineer as head is working in Karwar and 3 Sub Division @ Karwar, Sirsi & Yellapur with AEEs as heads are working in this District & by these offices, village roads under both the above schemes are implemented.

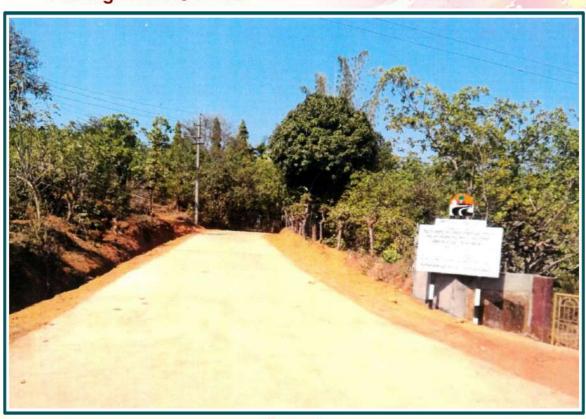

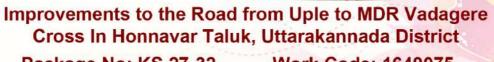
